CHILDRENS HOSPICE SOUTH WEST

A teenage girl from Cullompton who was bullied for having short hair has shaved it all off and raised more than £1,000 for Children's Hospice South West.

Kisa Benson, 14, knew she'd be mocked for her radical new look but said raising money for the charity was 'more important than a few mean comments'.

She said: "The charity means a lot to me so it was the right thing to do. You just need to keep your head held high and not let the bullies win."

Brave Kisa decided to lose her locks to raise vital funds for the charity's Little Bridge House children's hospice, which supports her best friend's younger brother. Reuben Newberry, aged nine from Willand, has polymicrogyria cerebral palsy and he and his family are able to access vital respite at the hospice, near Barnstaple in North Devon.

"The hospice has been a huge help, providing countless respite weekends for the whole family and I wanted to thank them for everything they have done," said Kisa, who has sadly suffered verbal and physical abuse since her head shave at the end of July.

"It was scary and I was quite upset – one time I just sat on the floor and cried – but Reuben and the charity mean so much to me, much more than a few people being horrible." Mum Theresa said she was proud of her daughter for taking a

stand for what she believed in.

"It was an incredibly brave thing for a teenage girl to do but even more so for Kisa as she has been bullied for having short hair. She knew that shaving her hair would put a bigger target on her head but didn't care because she was doing it for the right reason.

"Kisa has a huge heart and I'm incredibly proud of what she has done in support of a local family



who mean the world to us. "When she shaved off her hair it was very emotional, especially when she saw Reuben. But he still recognised her and gave her a beautiful beaming smile."





WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL CHAIR - COMMENT & REPORT

Where has the year gone to and more importantly where is it going?

Covid-19 is still causing problems around the world and for our homeland. We are fortunate at the time of writing that things are not quite so bad in our area as some parts but there is no justification for being complacent or showing a lack of consideration for others. The parish helpline is still in existence and can be utilised by those in need of help who have no other help available. We are fortunate that we still have a dedicated band of volunteers willing to help who will collect things or do shopping. Good neighbours looking out for one another is always to be encouraged but we must remember to respect the privacy of those who do not want help as they see it as intrusion.

If you are really worried about someone please contact the appropriate organisation but if all else fails call the parish helpline which will be detailed elsewhere in this magazine or on our website.

For those unfortunate to have been made redundant and finding it hard to properly feed children during school holidays there are local organisations and businesses that will help. It may be difficult but you will not be alone if you go about things the right way.

The current restrictions are making it difficult for normal things to take place. Simon, our Vicar, and his team were able to arrange a simple service by the war memorial on Remembrance Sunday and they used Zoom so that people could join in from the safety of their homes. A recording is also available for people to view. It was my privilege to be present to represent the Parish Council and Community as a whole and to lay a wreath on our behalf as part of the service.

The Parish Council is still meeting remotely once a month and all details are on the website and noticeboards. We have been two councillors short for some time but I am pleased to say that we are now up to full strength and am pleased to welcome Paul Major and Lisa Mastrolacasa as new members to the council. Let us hope that we can stay up to strength for the future.

Our play areas which are managed by the Parish Council are open and available for use. You will see that two new replacement sets of equipment and new safety surface has been supplied in the fenced play area by the school. Please enjoy and look after it as it has cost a lot of money which has been paid for from reserves which have been built up over time to deal with repairs and replacements. A working group is looking at finding and locating some equipment for our more senior residents to do some 'physical jerks' on. It will be situated somewhere with a bench so that you can recover afterwards.

Some will recall that MDDC wanted to close the Chestnut Drive play area and we are grateful to all those who responded to our questionnaire. We have a small working group consulting with MDDC officers and hopefully some of the

trees will be felled or trimmed as appropriate to make the area a little more open and some new equipment will be found to keep it going. Early days but it is being worked on.

Our play areas are regularly inspected for safety and once a year we have a full check by ROSPA and we have just had their report. Nothing major has been raised with just a few minor tweaks needed which the handyman is already working on. Have you seen the new fencing extending the cemetery area? Hedging has to be planted and then the site should cater for the needs of the village for some years to come.

We are still getting complaints about dog mess not being picked up around the village. Some really bad instances have come to note in the Jubilee field by the school entrance. If children get it on their shoes and take it into school it is a real problem. If you know who the offenders are and cannot face challenging them yourself then please tell we councillors through the clerk and we will see what can be done. Report all incidents you spot, with or without offenders, to MDDC Customer Services, ideally by email, as the more reports they get the better chance we have of visits from the enforcement team. Talking of school – come on parents – what is happening to social distancing with some of you at drop off and pick up times. The school has gone to great trouble to provide guides but then I suppose it does not apply to some of you – or that is what it looks like!

If anyone has a problem or concerns either from a parish or district perspective please feel free to contact me and I will see what I can do to help. There is a lot going on and changes are occurring with some regularity. Look at the parish website or Facebook pages if possible as we are trying to keep you all up to date.

People have been asking for a field where they can let their dogs run and we now have the Pooch's Playground by Westcountry Car Sales on the road to Cullompton. It is a commercial enterprise and is nothing to do with the Parish Council but the owner had the courtesy to tell us what he was doing and we were pleased to give verbal support as we knew it would meet the need of some of our residents. Another facility within our community.

Christmas is fast approaching but who knows who will be doing what because of lockdowns and advice. I would normally be going to Cardiff to join our daughter and her family. We may end up staying at home and opening a tin of corned beef. I wonder how many of our younger members of the community even know what that is.

Christmas can be lonely for some under normal times but it could be even worse this year. Keep an eye on your neighbours who may be on their own and although we may not be able to invite them into our homes it may be possible to cut out a spare dinner and pass it to them.

May I wish you all a very pleasant Christmas and a hoped for happy New- year. Hope you enjoy the Christmas lights. **Barry G J Warren.**

WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

On a Wednesday evening back in November, History Group members were taken on a virtual railway journey along the old Culm Valley branch line, having joined a Zoom meeting – sign of the times! – organised and hosted by Halberton History Group and Uffculme Local History Group. The speaker was by Amyas Crump, an authority on local railways, who really brought the Culm Valley Light Railway to life through his collection of photos and documents, following the line from Tiverton Station, via Halberton Halt, Tiverton Junction (in Willand),

Cold Harbour Halt, Uffculme and Culmstock Stations, before terminating at Hemyock.

Amongst the gems of information shared by Amyas was how Willand acquired its railway station. When the new Bristol-Exeter railway was built in the 1840s, a station had been earmarked for Sampford Moor near Sampford Peverall, but the roads around there were considered so treacherous that an alternative site in Willand was chosen, opened in 1844 under the name 'Park' Station (after nearby Park Farm) and then 'Tiverton Road' Station, before it was changed to 'Tiverton Junction' when the a branch line to Tiverton was added in 1848. The line to Tiverton was meant to have two tracks, but only one was ever completed. In 1928 a resourceful apple merchant, Mr Diggle, spotted an opportunity and rented a couple of miles worth of the empty space where the second track had

been intended – through Halberton – and planted apple trees in a long line alongside the existing track, probably the country's only railway embankment orchard. Amyas showed us an evocative photo of this, heading towards the aqueduct carrying the Grand Western Canal.

The Culm Valley branch from Tiverton Junction to Hemyock was opened in 1876 and was active for almost a century. The journey appears to have been a leisurely affair, considered the slowest passenger service on the whole British railway system – and there were rumours of cider stops for the train drivers. One of the steam locomotives that worked on the line was the famous Tivvy Bumper, which can now be seen housed at Tiverton Museum, although Amyas informed us that in fact this engine spent most of its working life around Oxford, before coming down to Devon. The passenger service ended in September 1963, but a freight service powered by diesel engines and primarily servicing the Hemyock milk factory ran until the line closed for good in 1975.

We enjoyed an excellent talk and it was good to see so many members of local history groups getting together, albeit virtually, and thanks must go to Halberton and Uffculme for getting this organised.

Finally, as we head towards Christmas, it would be understandable if some us enjoyed a bit of liquid relaxation, especially after the year 2020 has been! However, be wary as to where this can take you. In 1877 the Willand miller, George Lewis, woke up on the morning of Saturday, 22 December, in police custody in Tiverton, according to the *Tiverton Gazette*, "on a charge of being drunk and incapable at Brickhouse [in Tiverton], on the previous night. Defendant was found lying on the road hopelessly drunk by Constable Cosway. He was fined 5 shillings and costs."

So with that salutary warning, all of us in the History Group wish the rest of Willand a very happy festive season, and a much less turbulent 2021 James Morrison, 01884 250057 jamorrison235@gmail.com

It seems a little petty to then talk about life as an MDDC councillor yet we all must look to do as much as we can to make life as normal as possible, so it's back to budgets, dog mess and bin collections as some of the topics of the day.

Budgets are going to be a topic of ongoing conversation for a while, we are looking at an overspend of about £250k for 2020/21 no overspend is good but given the year we have had this could have been a lot worse, we will await what the next few months bring us but if I'm honest I think it will be between £200k & £300k. The current forecast for 2021/22 is far worse at nearly £3m however this does come with a warning that we have forecast no government assistance and some ongoing Covid-19 issues through our income streams, so although it's going to be an extremely difficult year I'm positive it will be far better than the current forecast. The recent debate on public open space orders created some keen interest from the public, so much so that the cabinet sent the paper back to the Environment committee for a further discussion.

Now finishing with a moan is never good so let's make it a request, MDDC are looking at having a trial for 3 weekly black bag collections, so that's NOT food that will still be every week and I understand so will recycling.

A random check last year saw a large number of black sacks opened pre going to the energy from waste plant, about 40% of the contents was stuff that should have been recycled tins, jars, bottles, plastic, cardboard, paper etc. So one of the arguments is that if we recycled what we should and can, then many would have less black sacks to collect, so please use your recycle box's, if you need more call MDDC and they will deliver more.

Ok that's me, have a great Christmas, enjoy what time you can with loved-ones let's hope next year brings more good than bad and we start to turn this around. If you need me call or email. Stay safe, keep well. Happy New Year.

AVIAN INFLUENZA (BIRD FLU)

You may be aware that there has been a number of Avian Influenza cases in the UK, one of which is in Devon. This has resulted in a National Protection Zone being put in place for all poultry keepers, including those who only keep a few birds in their back yard. We would be very grateful if you could include the following information, which has been released by DEFRA, in your next parish magazine or alternative forms of communication that you may use, to advise and guide poultry keepers on their legal obligations.

Poultry and other captive birds

An Avian Influenza Prevention Zone (PDF, 39.1KB, 6 pages) (AIPZ) has been declared across the whole of England effective from 5pm on 11 November 2020.All poultry keepers in England (whether they have commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard flock) are required by law to take a range of biosecurity precautions.

If you keep poultry (including gamebirds or pet birds) or other captive birds, you must act now to reduce the risk of disease in your flock by following the relevant biosecurity measures required within the AIPZ. Your stock needs to be feed and watered under cover to prevent contamination from wild birds.

Good biosecurity improves the overall health and productivity of your flock by helping keep out poultry diseases such as avian influenza and limiting the spread of disease in an outbreak.

All bird gatherings within the AIPZ are prohibited therefore the general licence that had permitted bird gatherings has been revoked.

If you find dead wild waterfowl (swans, geese or ducks) or other dead wild birds, such as gulls or birds of prey, you should report them to the Defra helpline (03459 33 55 77)

Public Health England advises that the risk to the public's health is very low. Food Standards Agency (FSA) has said that on the basis of the current scientific evidence, avian influenzas pose a very low food safety risk for UK consumers

Avian influenza is unconnected with coronavirus (COVID-19).

Voluntary registration

You can choose to register fewer than 50 birds, or birds you keep as pets. The Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) encourages you to register even if you do not have to by law.

By registering, APHA will be able to contact you if there's a disease outbreak (such as bird flu) in your area and you'll help prevent the spread of disease and protect the national poultry flock. Thank you. **Nicola L J Pearce Trading Standards Officer**

Did you know?

There is a constant risk of bird flu in the UK from wild birds. As it's highly contagious take action to protect your birds from catching it.





Remember

Any very sick birds, or unexplained deaths, must be assessed by your vet. By law suspicion of bird flu is notifiable and can affect poultry movement and trade.

Tip 1: Cleaning

Clean footwear before and after visiting your birds. Keep areas clean and tidy, and regularly disinfect hard surfaces. Humanely control rats and mice.





Tip 2: Feeding

Place your birds' food and water in fully enclosed areas that are protected from wild birds, and remove any spilled feed regularly.

Tip 3: Fencing

Keep your birds separate from wildlife and wild waterfowl by putting suitable fencing around the outdoor areas they access.




