EDITORIAL 154

Welcome to our spring issue a season to look forward and prepare for the summer months.

WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL CHAIR - COMMENT & REPORT

As I start writing this contribution to our Village Magazine the sun is shining, there are flowers out in the garden and we have a blackbird and wren nesting already. I have also been cheered up by reading entries on Facebook where people have been praising the welcome they have received as new residents to our community. These were followed by others who have been in the village for varying periods up to something like 20 years or more — all singing the praises of our community. As Chair of the Parish Council I know that all are not pleased all of the time and that is life and those of us who volunteer to be on the Council know what we are letting ourselves in for. We do our best to see to the 'administration' and the community is supported by volunteers who organise many things of interest for people to participate in if they wish. That is community. A belated but sincere thank you to RAYDA Plastics who made a generous donation to the cost of the Christmas lights.

Contractors have started to cut grass and tidy up around the village and John our litter picker continues to do his rounds. Some have raised issues about litter being blown around when recycling is put out for collection. That is not John's fault or even that of the bin men. We need to be careful when we put it out. Black boxes stand in the green boxes and that holds the cardboard in and then there are lids for the black boxes which sometimes need a brick or something placing on them to keep them in place if there is a wind. If you have lost your lid or need another box you only have to go on line to the MDDC site and one can be supplied. If you get a problem or have no internet you can always come to me for help.

On the subject of things on the street can I please make a plea to those that charm our area with horses and ponies – they are great to see particularly when children and young people are riding and looking after them – BUT – I have had my ear bent about some of the deposits they leave behind on pavements – they are a bit bigger than dog poo but not so dangerous but can make a mess. Better in the road if it has to be done. If they do it outside of my house I have a process – bucket, spade, roses.

Some Parish Councillors have been approached by worried residents as to information which is circulating concerning the theft of dogs. It is becoming a concern around the area but I am not aware of any actual thefts in Willand itself. Please take sensible precautions and have your dog chipped and/or tattooed. Do not leave the dog unattended in cars, tied up outside a shop or in your front gardens if you are not there. If the dog is kept in outside kennels then security lights or cameras are a sensible precaution as well as good locks and chains. If you are out walking the dog on your own be aware if you feel someone is following you.

With no panto this year I thought you may like to see what the National Operatic and Dramatic Association thought of our efforts in 2019 Sam Fincher

First a thank you to WITS for the warm welcome given to my wife and me on our first visit to the company and I hope it won't be the last!

This production of Red Riding Hood written by Roy Preston was a refreshing slant on the traditional story and so made it that much more interesting. As soon as the curtain opened the audience were treated to a projected back

cloth that enhanced the set and complemented the staging of the pantomime. The costumes were outstanding and helped get the various characters into their roles.

The Dame came on stage just a shade suddenly. Before you knew it, there she was in all her dazzling glory as the Grandma and right from the start, had the audience in the palm of her hand or should I say "his" a great performance played with enthusiasm and sang well too!

Red Riding Hood did well, also sang very well and played the role with tenderness and sensitivity looking every inch the part.

King Conkers who was eccentric and forgetful made the part very much his own, but at times, just went on a little too long on the forgetfulness theme. None the less was very endearing and had enviable energy. He was ably supported by his longsuffering and patient Herald.

As always in every pantomime you have a" goody ". In this case, Fairy Primrose and all in rhyme too! Unfortunately, the wand was pointing more to the floor than being upright for a lot of the time, but when the she got angry with the wolf she really came into her own. As for the Wolf, he looked every inch the sly villain, his costume was superb and a great speaking voice to match. A really good characterization.

Prince Harry looked good, sang very well indeed, connected well with the audience and complemented Red Riding Hood with some authentic exchanges.

The Squire commanded the stage as soon as she spoke! A terrific performance done with style and confidence. Great stage presence and timing. The scenes with the two stooges Meddle and Muddle were funny and well-timed . They were enthusiastic and had obviously put a lot of time and effort into their scenes together so that they bounced off each other really well "A Hole in my Bucket" was really funny and even though you knew what was coming with such a well-known number, they managed to put in several individual and different touches which held the attention of the audience.

The trees were such a great touch and not easy to pull off as it's difficult to show much individual characterisations in trees. But they did and did it well.

The animals looked good in amongst the trees, providing the "ah" factor, alwaysgood in a really local pantomime, along with some really talented young dancers.

POWER CUTS IN WILLAND

Our village is subject to sporadic power cuts without prior notice that can range from a few minute's outage to a few hours. The most recent outages that I was aware of were on: 11 February 2021 @ 01:03 & 11 February 2021 @ 01:35

There may have been others since that I am not aware of. I am sure that there are many members of our community that are inconvenienced by these unplanned electrical supply cuts both on an individual and business basis.

Regarding the power outages mentioned above, I contacted Western Power Distribution (WPD) who are our electricity distribution network operator for an explanation for the outages.

WPD advised that the fault was due to a broken overhead line on a pole in a field opposite their Primary substation. Some of our residences observed a 'flash' in the sky which would have been the breakdown of a connection to the High Voltage Over Head (OH) line. The fault is the sort that could be caused by a bird strike, although WPD did not find any conclusive evidence to confirm this was the cause.

I also, had responses from WPD regarding other queries that I raised with them:

Background as to why these sporadic power cuts occur?

Power cuts can happen due to various different reasons i.e. bird strikes, trees, third party activity, breakdown of network assets. WPD continually monitor their network by routine inspections of pole, helicopter flights of the OH network (i.e. power lines) looking for any potential future issues such as trees within the safe distance to OH cables. They also carry out a rolling program of network upgrade works including adding automation points to the network to reduce time taken to restore supplies to customers.

Why do these power cuts occur at different days / times?

It varies dependant on the cause of the incident, more often than not it is weather related affecting OH cables & joints. It can also, be caused by damage to the WPD network by a third party which can cause either an immediate network trip or one that causes a gradual breakdown of the network.

What is being carried out to resolve these issues and stopping them happening?

WPD have a routine inspection programme of their assets which involve a team of inspectors that will survey the OH network and the wooden poles, Substation inspectors also, visit all of WPD's Primary and secondary sites where they maintain the plant and equipment. WPD also have a helicopter unit based in Bristol that will routinely fly the network looking for anything untoward or for any trees or vegetation that is in close proximity to the OH network.

You might have seen the helicopters as they are easily recognisable in bright yellow with WPD stamped on the side. WPD also use helicopters to help locate faults rapidly.

The upgrade works will also assist in a more reliable network.

Why can't advance notice be provided?

WPD will always advise customers of planned interruptions by letter. If there are customers with specific needs, WPD are made aware of this via their Priority Services Register (PSR). WPD will call these users on the PSR to check if they will be able to manage without power during the planned interruption. Unfortunately, due to the nature of a fault WPD are not always aware of it happening until the circuit trips.

WPD know this can be particularly worrying if a customer relies on electricity for medical equipment; if they are elderly, very ill; have extra communication, access / safety needs or disabled. WPD have special arrangements in place for vulnerable customers who depend on electricity and for whom power cuts may be particularly worrying. Sometimes power cuts can happen for reasons beyond their control.

This special arrangement is the Priority Services Register (PSR) and is free to join. It helps WPD to look after vulnerable customers whilst enabling WPD to tailor their services to support households who may need extra help.

If you are experiencing a fault and need to contact WPD just dial 105 and the system will be able to ascertain your location and whether you are calling from a landline or a mobile phone.

STREET LIGHTING SWITCHING ON / OFF TIMINGS

Karen Whatley, Parish Councillor raised an issue to me that arises after a power cut has happened where some street lighting is not working in some areas of the village and the timings of the switching on / off of the lighting is affected.

Street Lighting is the responsibility of Devon County Council (DCC). I contacted DCC Street Lighting Team for an explanation as to why, when the village has the misfortune of having an electricity power cut / failure, the street lighting switches on / off in a different time / pattern to that before the power cut / failure. Devon County Councils – Street Lighting Teams response was as follows:

It is unusual for a timing fault to naturally occur in whole sections of lights at the same time; if this occurs, this has most likely been caused by a power cut and should be temporary.

The street lighting in the village is mostly individually controlled by light sensitive cells on the top of the lights which switch the lighting on at dusk and off at dawn. In the case of part night lights, the type of cell fitted also switches off at approximately 12:30 GMT for 5 hours and then back on at approximately 05:30 until dawn. Following a power cut the cell resets, causing lighting to remain on all night or operate at incorrect times until the control cell re-learns the switching periods from natural light levels. This should happen within a week but can take up to ten days in some cases.

As the mornings get lighter the streetlights will switch later, in the summer months they may not switch on at all in the mornings due to higher daylight levels. (The day beginning, and end times are governed by the environment, not the clock.)

DDC Street Lighting Team are happy to investigate any on-going issues being experienced. If any lights are misbehaving, they will need to know which ones by being advised of the street lightings column number which is on the lighting column (pole) and any observed details of the fault so it can be passed to their maintenance team.

The best way for a member of our community to report lighting issues is via the following: Online: https://www.lightsonindevon.co.uk/



You enter your postcode and then choose the appropriate street lighting column via its associated street lighting column number on an interactive map. This allows you to check if a fault has already been reported and for you to report a fault. It is advisable for the person reporting the fault to leave their email address so that DCC Street

Lighting Team can get in touch if there are reasons for delays, or if they require further information.

Also, if there are on-going or intermittent problems this can be communicated directly with the person who reported the fault.

DCC Street Lighting Team have asked that as they are a small admin team, could any issues please, in the first instance be reported via the website.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

I have come to the end of another term for me, it runs out in May. I have enjoyed working for this community and hope I have been able to help in various ways, working with Parish Councils and so on, can't always please everybody, but I try to do what I can. I do thank everyone for your support.

I will be standing for another 4 year term.

As you know, DCC have announced its budget for 2021/22 and there has been unavoidable increases, the increase will be 4.99%, 3% for the adult services which is agreed by Government and 1.99% which is the maximum increase level set by Government. Over and above the figures stated below, there will be an additional £600k going into road maintenance. We will be putting £300k into Climate Change over the next two years, to help, together with District Councils bring about zero carbon by 2030. There looks to be light at the end of the tunnel on COVID, This tremendous effort to fight coronavirus, support Devon's communities and keep the county operating has cost the authority significantly.

The increased number of people eligible for help with Council Tax, coupled with more firms being forced to go out of business and leaving properties empty, is contributing to a financial shortfall for authorities at a time when spending demands are increasing.

The increase in Government funding for the authority is £3.7 million or 2.2%. The Government has also announced Devon's share of national Covid-19 funding for 2021/22 is £14.823 million. In total, our spending in 2021/22 is due to rise by 6.6%, an overall increase of just under £35.7 million from 2020/21. We will continue to do all we can to support all those affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. In the knowledge that we will come out of this pandemic with new and innovative ways of working to ensure we continue on our journey as a learning organisation

It was hard to imagine that a return to normal would happen quickly. The rapidly changing circumstances led to a review of the Targets. Some savings previously identified did not seem feasible and the other areas needed bolstering to increase the resilience of the authority. The detailed budget targets were set by Cabinet on 13th January which total £578.5 million. The total includes funding for budget pressures of £47.3 million that mainly relates to additional expenditure to allow for service growth to cater for demographic changes such as increased children and adult service users and unavoidable cost pressures. Savings and income initiatives of £11.6 million are required to set a balanced budget. The targets set for each service area have been subject to different pressures and influences. We have achieved this budget, without dipping into any reserves.

WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

Towards the end of last year, History Group members joined a Zoom talk on 'Mapping the Historic Character of the Culm', held under the auspices of the Connecting the Culm project (information at connectingtheculm.com), which includes mapping the landscape archaeology of the River Culm- for example, recording old mill leats or water meadows — from its headwaters in the Blackdown Hills to where it joins the River Exe at Stoke Canon. The talk inspired us to reflect on how Willand's own history has been influenced by local river systems — not only the Culm and Spratford Stream, but also a less well-known watercourse that runs across the parish and was known, glamorously, as the 'Willand Drains'.

The source of Willand Drains was a small body of water, now long gone, but located at what is now the junction onto the main road (B3181) at the bottom of the hill from the 'old' village. According to the 1839 Tithe Map this was called 'Merlin's Pond'. Was this just a cheeky name for an old murky pond, or could it

be a tantalising hint at some long-forgotten local folklore? Either way, the Willand Drains then ran in a westerly direction across a field called Muirlands (or Murlands), where it was described as an 'open sewer' — according to the old meaning of 'sewer' as a 'drainage channel', not a conveyor of human waste. The field name Muirlands, and that of its neighbour Moorhayes, derive from the definition of 'moor' as a 'low-lying marshy area' — which would have flagged up how this was poor agricultural land, only really useful for rough grazing, and even then farmers needed to be wary of livestock diseases such as liver fluke, hosted by mud snails that thrive in poorly-drained, boggy places such as these.

When Dr Tracey built The Gables in the mid-1890s he purchased these and other fields around his new house to landscape into parkland, which included planting the woods that are now managed by the Woodland Trust. One source suggests that at this time Willand Drains were 'piped' under the fields, although map evidence appears to show it was channelled along a system of ditches. But this was not before Dr Tracey "... in an unusual feat of marksmanship, one with each barrel I was told, shot a brace of snipe in Muirlands ... probably feeding in this open drain, as they do. They were stuffed and exhibited [in] one of the many glass cases full of all sorts of birds in The Gables hall," as described by his son, JB Tracey, years later. During the late-1980s this area was developed into the Meadow Park housing estate and the old watercourse presumably well and truly buried (beneath Sycamore Close) thanks to modern engineering.

From what is now Meadow Park the Willand Drains flowed in a south-west direction, following the hedgerow across the fields that are now earmarked for further housing development. Research is yet to reveal the extent of underground drainage in these fields, historic or otherwise, and it will be interesting to see if anything is revealed by the preliminary groundwork for this development. Any Victorian tile-pipes are likely to have silted up decades ago, and the fields certainly have a propensity to hold water after heavy rain. Along one of the hedges is a historic pond, now much diminished and choked by willow, but when I was growing up, during the 1980s, it was a proper farmland pond, and a great place to find long strings of toad spawn!

The Willand Drains watercourse now emerges in the corner of these fields, where it flows through a culvert under the M5 Motorway. It then runs along a hedge and ditch before being funnelled underneath the railway, emerging into the shallow valley at Dean Hill. It is here that the Willand Drains can be viewed today in its full glory as a flowing stream, albeit channelled along ditches to pass underneath Dean Hill Road ('Round the World'). Once again, the old field names tell us what type of land this was: running alongside the stream below Dean Hill Farm is Honey Mead, possibly named because its meadow flowers were a bounty for bees, but more likely because the soil there could be sticky as honey. Here, the stream was once famed for its watercress, and willows still grow in the hedgerows, revealing its watery character. From there the stream flows

Research into Willand Drains and the landscape it passes through is still ongoing, so if you can add to what we know about this or any of Willand's other watercourses, we'd love to know.

Building works on site are progressing well (at least when the weather has been on our side). We are working to replace guttering and re-point the Grist Mill – with some additional internal decorating and security installation.

The path leading along the front of the Mill building has now been dug out and widened, and will soon be re-laid with a new self-binding surface. This is to make the entrance more accessible and allow for wheelchairs and buggies to cross paths with no problem. It will also allow for distanced outside queuing as required for social distancing when the Mill reopens to the public. We are also taking the opportunity to redo the pathway leading from the shop up to the chimney, which we hope will give a great first impression to our visitors entering this area.



Visitor Route Signage & Interpretation

We are currently working on additional signage for visitors to point out all of the outbuildings and additional interpretation for the outside areas so that visitors are made aware of the history of the whole site rather than just the collections inside the factory. The addition interpretation will highlight the buildings in the Mill yard.


