# CULM VALLEY MODEL RAILWAY AT THE OLD WELL

On **Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> of September from 10am until 4 pm** The Culm Valley Model Railway Club will hold a mini show of our club layouts at the Old Well Garden Centre EX15 3ES (near Junction 27 of the M5).

This replaces our annual show which was to have taken place in Willand on the same date but due to the uncertainty of COVID-19 we have decided to postpone it for yet another year.

So we have decided to hold a smaller event. At the top car park at the Old Well Garden Centre is our building housing our 30' layout of Tiverton Junction as it was in the early 1960's, before the motorway was built. Outside we will have 2 marquees housing Uffculme station as it was prior to closure, a large layout featuring more modern trains called Extown and a fun layout called Blackdown. We will also have a stall selling items of model railway interest.

Admission is free though we would be grateful for any donations to help towards the hire of the marquees.

Please come along for a family day out. Afterwards you can visit the garden centre for a browse and have a coffee and a cake (or something more substantial).

# WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL CHAIR - COMMENT & REPORT

It is raining, the sun is shining and the grass and everything else appears to be growing faster than contractors and Council workers can get around to cut it all back. They are doing their best and there is the odd polite reminder from the Parish Clerk as appropriate. What a wonderful opportunity for me to thank all those who are doing their bit to cut back growth from their own gardens to help keep the footpaths clear. It also allows me to make a plea to those that have not done so yet to think about tackling these jobs if needed.

The Parish Council has been holding its meetings in the Church Hall for the past couple of months to comply with the social distancing advice but I suspect that we will be back in the Village Hall Annex for our September meeting.

Please check the notice boards and website for final details. There is a vacancy on the Parish Council so please watch the announcements in case we have an election to fill the vacancy.

Our speed detection device should soon be back with us after a bit of teething trouble with water ingress. Initial findings have shown that far too many are driving over the speed limit in Silver Street so please slow down before the Speed Camera Teams use the information to target the trouble times. It's expensive to get caught apart from the potential danger speeding drivers may be causing to other road users.

With the lighter evenings and exams over some of our young people are having time on their hands and a few are putting themselves and others at risk with their activities. The odd bit of damage has been caused around and we all have to pay to put it right or else lose the facility. It is OK having a party but please put the rubbish in the bins – there are plenty around the village – and if they are full, please take your rubbish home. Breaking bottles in the play areas is not a good idea and for those of you who have been spotted with the odd gas canister and other funny substances I wonder what your parents would say. Please use common sense as life is too short to go and ruin it. To those in our community who help by clearing up after these incidents – thank you. Please report crime or anti-social behaviour to the police at the time – even if you just send an email.

Sadly, the state of some of our roads is not getting any better in spite of representations made by individuals and the Parish Council to DCC Highways and our County Councillor. If a hole is not big enough to fit the criteria it will not get repaired yet it is still a trip hazard for anyone crossing the roads, particularly at night when streetlights have been switched off. It is also hazardous for cyclists at a time when we are encouraged to get out on our bikes. Not with my knees you won't! # **DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL**

We have not really got going at Devon County yet, because of all the inductions for new members. For me I am on the Corporate Infrastructure and Regulatory Scrutiny (CIRS), the Devon & Somerset Fire Service, being the main committees, the smaller ones being the Highways and Traffic Orders Committee (HATOC), the Canal Advisory, the Westleigh Quarry advisory and the Broadpath Advisory.

Not sure if there are any problems within Willand area that concerns County, of course, there may be, please let me know if something arises. I do note that there is always speed problems with some, this will always happen, we need to try and keep on top of it, but mainly it has to be a policing problem.

I have been involved with bringing better broadband in the Willand area, this will be coming about this year, Gigaclear will be the main provider. Airband are the providers under the Connecting Devon & Somerset (CDS) banner.

Other things happening at County;

A programme of bids totalling more than £12.2 million has been submitted by Devon County Council to a new government funding scheme which aims to support communities and businesses to recover after the coronavirus pandemic.

Devon's bid is made up 16 projects from across the county which have the potential to generate around 620 jobs, support the creation of 400 new businesses, and help 3,000 people to retrain.

The Department for Education recently published school admissions data stating that Devon is a high performing local authority in meeting parental preference for school places.

## Devon primary schools

Devon is ranked sixth out of 150 local authorities in the country (and first in the 14 local authorities in the south west) for meeting parental preference requests for primary school places.

- 97.6% first preference rate for Devon primary schools, up from 94.7% last year, significantly better than national (91.8%) and regional (93.8%)
- 99.6% top three preference rate for Devon primary schools, up from 98.2% last year, better than national (98.0%) and regional (98.7%)

**Devon secondary schools** Devon is ranked 28<sup>th</sup> out of 150 local authorities in the country (and sixth in the 14 local authorities in the south west) for meeting parental preference requests for secondary school places.

- 91.2% first preference rate for Devon secondary schools, down slightly from 92.3% in the previous year, significantly better than national (81.1%) and regional (86.5%)
- 97.5% top three preference rate for Devon secondary schools, similar to 97.4% last year, better than national (93.4%) and regional (95.9%).

This year sees us celebrating 10 years of the Snow Wardens Scheme; a scheme that without committed volunteers would fail to complement our winter service. Without their support over the winter period there could be a significant impact on the network; effecting local communities, vulnerable people and the economy.

In February members were informed Devon County Council and NHS Devon CCG had agreed with North Devon Health Care Trust not to renew the Living Well at Home service contract at the end of its natural term.

The service delivered by NDHT known as Devon Cares has been arranging care on behalf of DCC and CCG to people in those areas but does not directly deliver the care itself.

This decision means that Devon County Council will take back the day to day direct management of those care arrangements, working in close partnership with the same local care providers. People who are currently receiving domiciliary care arranged by Devon Cares on our behalf will continue to receive their service from the same care provider, with the same care arrangements.

We are working closely with Devon Cares and local care providers, and with individual clients and their families, to ensure that the transition is made without disruption to people's service.

This change in arrangement has commenced from the 21st June 2021.

In 2021/22 our principal term contractor, has changed from Skanska to Milestone Infrastructure Ltd (MI) a subsidiary company of M Group Services. The novation of the term contract over to MI was completed in April and the expectation is there will be no noticeable change in the delivery of the services formerly provided by Skanska. **Councillor Ray Radford**

They are telling us we are now in summer. The weather the last few weeks certainly didn't seem to be very summer like, still we've had about a day and a half of better sunny weather so my grass has grown about a foot a day, the delights of an English summer seemingly consistent in all its variables.

The Ward has been relatively quiet, a couple of issues with 2 Sisters around rubbish left on the street but in fairness the site manager is quick to react and sort any reported issues.

I'm getting relatively few, just a couple of very localised complaints around odours, sent to me directly, now this could be a good thing or individuals may be calling the Environment Agency help line and reporting them directly?

Just in case you've lost the number it's 0800 807060, open 24/7 please if you have an issue report it. I am also happy to be informed and would appreciate any details via email, especially the incident number you will be given. You can also report without having to give your name.

I know the Parish Council are looking at formulating a Neighbourhood Plan and would encourage you all to get involved. It's a way you can have a say on what can be built and how it can be built in our communities. If you have any questions you can go to the MDDC web pages to read about Neighbourhood Plans or just Google the words.

The other thing is to attend a Parish Council meeting, they would be delighted to see you and answer any questions.

On planning I'm going to do a name drop. I don't get many opportunities to do this so here goes ....as the MDDC Portfolio Holder for Housing I was invited to a Zoom call with the Minister - Robert Jenrick. I've done a couple of these calls and it's normally something like 300 participants and a Minister or underling talking at you for 30 minutes with time at the end for 2 questions that have been pre-selected. Well not this time.

The meeting was the Minister and four South West Councillors with responsibility for housing. It was a very relaxed affair and we all managed to get a number of questions direct to the Minister, not a senior civil servant in sight.

I won't go into detail here but I will give the next Parish Council a brief run down. If you are interested pop along, or drop me a line.

On the subject of housing I'm absolutely delighted and proud to be fronting the modular housing schemes here in Mid Devon. The display unit will be open to the public from Monday 26th July in the car park at the Cullompton Leisure Centre, please go have a look, I think you will be pleasantly surprised.

There are two sites one in Cullompton and one in Tiverton for which planning permission will be sought very soon and depending on the success of those applications there are other sites waiting in the wings. These are not temporary houses, they have a builders guarantee in excess of 75 years similar to new build houses by any of the big developers.



Our theme will be Willand 1952-2022 (we've yet to think of a catchy title), which will include village events and celebrations, as well as looking at some of the changes that have happened in the parish during in that time – there's been a few.

With the Exhibition in mind, we are looking to gather any photos, cuttings, documents, memorabilia, memories and recollections, or really anything to do with Willand over the last 70 years, right up to and including the Covid pandemic. We are keen to get as many people involved as possible, whether you've been in Willand for days or decades.

We have a group meeting coming up on Tuesday, 10 August 2021, 7.00pm, at The Annex of Willand Village Hall – at which we hope to start planning the exhibition, but also look at several new items that have come forward for the Willand Archive. We are also planning a Willand Wander (or Wonder) on Sunday, 22 August 2021, meeting at 4.00pm in the Willand Village Hall car park. Weather permitting, this will be a short group walk around the village (route to be decided) to start making a photographic record of some of the changes to the parish over the last 70 years, and to get some now-then photo comparisons for the Exhibition. If you have an interest in the village, would like to learn more about Willand's past, or can tell us more, or if you'd like to get involved in our 2022 exhibition, please get in touch on the contact details below to book a place. You are all more than welcome.

Many thanks to Betty Penberthy, who has emailed us some of her memories of Willand, amongst which she recalls the impact of the M5 motorway, built in the 1970s. Before its arrival, "During the summer months it was almost impossible to get across the main road due to traffic. The village policeman would come and hold up the traffic so that the District Nurse could visit her patients. He was Jock MacLean and lived on the main road in a police house, near Spearing's garage. He was very strict and the children always made sure they were behaving when he was about. The Railway Inn along with the railway cottages were all demolished [for the M5] and also the Assembly Rooms. I can remember those rooms, before the Village Hall was completed. Evidently it was the hub of the village, with dances, whist drives, etc., all held there. Round the World began just beyond the Chapel and it was a lovely walk. We were always walking there with our prams and the children on their bikes, etc. No traffic. I did not know until my niece snitched on them, that her two brothers and my four boys used to run along the top of the railway bridge, over the main railway line, just for fun - I'm glad I didn't know.

We would take a picnic round there, and we would meet up with the other village folk too. Right at the top near the main road was the Jubilee Tree, a very big tree, all taken down. There was a big house belonging to Mr and Mrs Batten which was also demolished, but Mr Batten insisted that a replica was built the other side of the road and that's still there [between the ESSO garage and the motorway]. There was a little bungalow there too, opposite of what is now Diggerland, at the entry to Verbeer, that was also lost."
