After the Jubilee Celebrations and some fabulous weather everyone is now gearing up for the summer holiday period. There seems to be lots to do locally. WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL CHAIR- COMMENT & REPORT

I am preparing these notes early in the morning with the sun already shining but no electricity as we have another power cut in our area of the village with one of those niggling faults that is intermittent and they are having trouble finding the actual location. Thank goodness we still have a gas hob so that I can boil some water for a cup of coffee. What will happen when we are all electric? For now, we have holes in the road and a generator on a neighbour's drive which has been going all night so must be thankful that we were soon connected back to electricity. I must say that the response from the Western Power staff with whom I have had contact has been excellent to date.

In spite of this life goes on in the village and those of you that get around will have seen that they have started work on the Meadow Park site to build the 125 houses and the infrastructure that will go with it. The footpath along the edge of the woods and down to the motorway should be kept open and I have seen that fencing has been put up to keep the footpath separate from the building site. Please be careful as you cross the entrance to the site. Any problems or worries you know where to find me.

Despite the dry weather the hedges are still continuing to grow over the footpaths and pavements. The potholes are also continuing to appear in the roads. The Parish Council and District Councillors are chasing things up to get it resolved when we know about it but please make the relevant report-yourselves either to Customer Services at Mid Devon or the Devon County Highways website https://www.devon.gov.uk/roadsandtransport/report-a-problem/ where you can actually mark the spot on a map. Please remember that if you are the owner of the land from which the vegetation is growing it is your responsibility to cut it back.

John and his volunteers have managed to update the planters around the village and once again the Old Well Garden Centre has supplied the plants with a generous discount on the price. Thank you to all those involved.

As of 1stJune 2022 the Parish Council has taken the lease of the Chestnut Drive/Maple Close play area from Mid Devon District Council to prevent it being closed. In doing so we have obtained quite a substantial financial package to go towards refurbishing it and a councillor is busy getting quotes to do the work. Would you believe the difficulty he is having in getting firm quotations as suppliers are worried at the unstable financial markets at present? No doubt those of you amongst us who are contemplating building works and the like may

be experiencing the same problems. If anyone has any ideas as to how to spend the money on something else regrettably it is ring fenced to that one project.

Bit of a moan now but it ought to be of concern to all of us who pay council tax into the Parish precept. The Parish has been trying to repair the goal post areas within the Jubilee Field. One large goal post at the Gables Lea end 'collapsed' due to the base being rusted through. Continual drenching with wee from dogs looks to have been the main factor but it has a knock-on effect, not only in financial terms but also for a couple of days we had to suspend the use of the area for night landings of the Air Ambulance. Luckily no emergency requiring its use during this time. The handyman also tried to repair the ground, in the interests of safety, in the small goal mouths and he put up some fencing to protect the area whilst the ground settled. Children will be children and they wrecked it a number of times and were using the fenceposts as weapons. This is costing us all money and so if there is a repetition of damage it could mean that we take the goal posts away completely. Believe it or not over £40,000 was spent on refurbishing and renewing some of the equipment in the fenced play area for the smaller children and this has been damaged and had to be repaired already. With summer holidays coming please try and instil some sense of responsibility into those causing any damage and report them to the Police.

It has come to my attention that the bus timetables for the village will be amended and some reductions made to service from the end of July and so if you are a bus-user please make sure you check the timetables. It looks as if Uffculme will be worse off than Willand and getting to Tiverton Parkway to catch a train will be an experience to be avoided.

In October the District Council will be introducing three weekly collections (instead of two weekly) for the 'black bag' rubbish. Food waste collections will still be weekly and recycling and garden waste will still be two-weekly. preparation for the change as of now households will be receiving delivery of wheelie bins to put the 'black bag' rubbish in. As soon as you receive one you can use it and put it out on the current set date. There is plenty of press publicity and details are on the MDDC website. There will also be leaflets delivered to each house and there will be notes fixed to the bins to help. We have published details on the Parish Website and Facebook pages and will keep this updated. Please read it so that you get an understanding. If you do not have room, or an access to cater for a bin, then there are alternatives. If you need more than one bin because you have a large family or special circumstances then let the District Council know and you will receive assistance or advice to overcome the problem. There will be the odd 'hiccup' but remember 'there are no problems in this world only Solutions'. If you have an issue talk to MDDC Customer Services. If all else fails then speak to one of your District Councillors. Their details are in the magazine and on the websites.

Discussions are also going on to possibly change the Parish Boundaries and a document will soon be out for public consultation. Please make sure that you respond with your views. One of the main issues is the fact that Halberton

Parish covers ground between Willand and Uffculme yet really has no connection with that village other than on paper. We have to try and sort it now as it is no good moaning later. One other recommendation coming out is that Willand will go from 11 to 12 Parish Councillors as our population of voters is growing. We have trouble getting 11 at present so it does need more of you to become involved. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we had to have a Parish Council election in May 2023 as more than 12 people had put their names forward some of us may want to retire.

Keep safe and please work for the good of our community. Remember – a problem shared is a problem halved. If there is a problem that you think the Parish or District Councils can help resolve you know where I am so talk to me.

WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

First of all, we would like to thank everyone who came to our Queen's Platinum Jubilee Exhibition on 2 June. Your support and enthusiasm made a lot of hard work behind the scenes more than worthwhile. Because it was our first exhibition for a few years we weren't sure what to expect, but we were delighted to be kept busy throughout the day, with many visitors buoyed by both the Jubilee spirit and the sunny weather! There was plenty of nostalgia to indulge in, with displays on Willand Jubilees and Royal events through the ages, plus a focus on the 1950s and 1970s, and with the surprise addition a 1952 Land Rover, thanks to Kit Hancock and his incredible rebuilding job. There were teas, coffees, cakes, scones and a proper Jubilee trifle, with live music kindly provided by Paul Hockey, which was enjoyed by all and culminated in a rousing rendition of the National Anthem (most of our singing was in tune!). It was great to meet up with friends and supporters again, many of whom we had not seen since 'before Covid', many being lifelong Willand residents, as well as meeting lots of people new to Willand but keen to learn more about the place they live. As can be imagined, there was plenty of lively chat about how life in Willand has changed over the last 70 years, what it's like now, and how it ought to be in the future!! We would like to thank everyone for sharing their memories and stories, for bringing items along on the day, for putting names to faces on our photos on display, and for leaving us with lots of gueries and contacts to follow up on. We were left with a real appreciation for the fact that, despite the many changes. our parish still has at its core a community of people who feel really connected to Willand, and who care a lot about its past and its future.

On the evening of Tuesday, 16 August, we are planning to hold our Willand History Group 'summer walk', exploring the historic landscape to the north of the parish. After meeting at the Halfway House, the planned route is to follow the main road northeast out of the parish to the top of Pitt Lane (on the left, before Hitchcock's business park), and then follow the lane northwest down the hill, before turning southwards, parallel to the motorway, swinging back up the hill into Muxbeare lane - going through the 'deserted' medieval village of Muxbeare - and back to the Halfway. Pre-development archaeological explorations around Four Cross Ways (the Co-Op roundabout) have confirmed the many phases of human activity in this area, including evidence of a possible early Neolithic mortuary enclosure, Bronze Age field boundaries, Romano-British timber structures, and medieval holloways. Walking along the ridge near the top of Pitt Lane it is still possible to get a sense of how this was all placed within the broader landscape, as a meeting of routeways from north to south, and set between the Blackdown Hills to the east and the Lowman Valley and Tiverton hills to the west. The recent discovery of a Romano-British iron smelting site in Halberton suggests that there would have been important routes transporting iron ore across this area north of Willand, from the nearest ore extraction sites up in the Blackdowns. Others features to look out for include the location of the old blacksmith's workshop at the end of Halfway House car park; the boundaries of Willand Moor, the parish's common land that was

enclosed in the early 1800s; the site of an old communal water meadow that later had its strips enclosed and labourer's cottages built on them, the remains of which can still be found in the hedges there. WILLAND COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH (WCSW)

Having announced our 'going live' in the last magazine, I'm pleased to say that we have continued to run speed watch sessions since then and will gradually increase the number of sessions, and on more roads in the village, in the coming weeks.

We have operated at only a limited number of sites since launch because it takes a while to get used to the operational processes but, we submitted the data from our last session and this resulted in a number of vehicles being sent letters by the police. Repeat offences may result in further action.

As I write this update, we hope to have approval shortly from the central CSW team at police HQ in Exeter for sites on virtually every road in Willand where vehicles speed. Beware.

We do need more volunteers to join the team, and our effectiveness will be greatly reduced if we don't get them so, if you can spare a bit of time, please email me on **davidjmarrow@icloud.com** It isn't onerous - just an hour every now and again will be a big help.

June's figures from the VAS box showed that over 10,000 vehicles travelled at 35mph or more along Silver Street, and that was just in one direction! That's an average of over 360 'speeders' a day, in just one direction, on the road that has our school. Please remember what I always say, **our objective is not to 'catch' drivers speeding but to remind them to keep to the speed limit.**



MID DEVON DISTRICT COUNCIL

As I started to put some thought to the content of this month's article, I initially thought I would struggle as there appeared to be not a great deal going on how wrong I was as my mind started to list a number of local and area wide issues that I hope will be of interest.

I'll start with the new **revised refuse collection scheme**. This is due to start in October. I know it seems a long way off but sadly it will be here all too soon.

What does the council expect to achieve from 3 weekly collections?

- Reduced carbon footprint
- A reduction in non-recyclable materials
- Predicted increase in recycling rate
- An increase in the amount of food waste collected

One main area of concern is the amount of food and recyclable material that's still placed in black sacks. By reducing the black sack/wheelie bin collections to every three weeks it's hoped that more people will start to separate cans, bottles, cardboard and small electrical items and put these in the boxes provided. This reduces the amount we send to the energy from waste facility and increases the amount we can send to be reused/recycled.

Food waste shouldn't be put in the black sacks. Please if you don't have a food waste bin just ask for one, call 01884 255255 and MDDC will deliver one to you free of charge. If you put it in a blue bin MDDC collect it weekly, if you stick it in a black sack, it's there for three weeks.

Community Governance review (revised parish boundaries)

At the full council meeting of 6th July council approved that the current proposals for local boundary alterations be sent out for a second consultation. I think it's fair to say the process hasn't had too many issues with the exception of Willand, Halberton and Uffculme. Without doubt these proposals have proven extremely time consuming and thought provoking.

My opinion in that the proposals should allow local people and their elected representatives to be able to influence and comment on local issues and not let others dictate what goes in in our community.

The main proposals for Willand & Uffculme are:

- 1. Lucombe Park move from Halberton to Uffculme and the Mid Devon Business Park move from Halberton to Willand.
- 2. As above, plus together with the area North East of Bridwell Avenue to be moved from Halberton to Uffculme
- 3. As in 1&2 plus Hitchcocks and Langlands Business Parks move from Halberton to Uffculme.

Please watch out for local press releases and check the Parish Council web site for more updates. The more people that comment the stronger the local voice.

Gables road hedge cutting

I do enjoy my role as your local councillor but have to admit that on occasions it can become extremely frustrating as the time it takes to get a simple task agreed and done can be excruciating and painfully long winded.

The hedge in Gables Road clearly needed cutting as it had grown nearly half way across the road. It was dangerous as it caused traffic to have to swing out into the path of traffic coming in the opposite direction. All this adjacent to the pre-school and the Willand Primary School entrance in Gables Road.

Having contacted Devon County Highways the saga began as their initial reaction was it didn't fit their criterial for immediate action added to which they claimed it wasn't their responsibility.

This resulted in me asking the police via my "Councillor Advocate Police Liaison Role" to take a look. The report from the Police Sargent Traffic Officer was damming to say the least - yet still DCC stated they had to follow their processes.

Even a direct plea to both the DCC Portfolio Holder for Highways and the DCC Council Leader met with total intransigence.

Frustrated and annoyed I simply persisted and with the help of Devon County Councillor, Ray Radford, we eventually did get it done (although that still took two attempts as they had to come back to do it a second time).

Co-op zebra crossing

I understand that some have been making comments on this subject on social media on what's beings done via the local shop staff. Please please ignore any such comments. The situation is being dealt with via the Co-op's CEO Office, Devon County Council Highways Officers and myself.

The latest communication from the CEO's office is in part detailed below. Although it's unfortunate that this remains fully unresolved it's all in hand and will be done, that I will assure you.

"Thank you for your email. I raised this with the Property Team and I have received the response below from the Property Construction Manager:

I was actually on leave on the 5th June, so was not myself at that meeting with the highways officer, but I did have dialogue with the highways officer prior to my holiday.

I share the Cllr's frustrations, however sometimes we need to take two steps back to move forward, and unfortunately due to relevant personal leaving and retiring, across key internal and external parties, involved in the scheme, and who are no longer working in or within our framework requirements, I am left to pick up the pieces to review, plan, and ultimately rectify and resolve as required. A separate Principle Contractor who will reviewing historic information sent across Thursday evening, and we plan to catch up early next week, once relevant information has been digested, including contacts for who will actually carry out the works. I need for

them to assist myself to plan what is required to complete the works, so we can leave to the required standards as needed.

Please be assured that we will carry out the works as soon as we are able to do so, but with the required approvals from external parties (i.e. Highways) in place. It is not my intention nor Coop to delay these works, that are required and needed. However until I have spoken to my Principle Contractor, I cannot give timescales to complete."

As you see, progress yes but completion - not just yet but we will get there.

And Finally: I'm here to help

Can I remind all that if you have any issues or concerns you can contact me anytime via my email or Facebook pages or you can obviously just call me on my mobile number. I run monthly surgeries at both Willand (every second Saturday each month in the Village Hall) or Uffculme every third Saturday of the month in Square Corner.

Both run from 10am until noon, call for an appointment or just pop in. Bob Evans
