### **WILLAND HISTORY GROUP**

At the time of writing, our nation has entered a period of mourning following the death of Queen Elizabeth II, and the History Group would wish to echo the many heartfelt and wholly justified tributes being made to an incredible woman, and, whatever your views, the turning of a remarkable period in our history. Similarly, back in February 1952, following the death of her father, the front page of our local newspaper the Devon & Somerset News reported on how the Queen's accession was formally proclaimed around the district: "Bright weather prevailed, and the traditional procedure was followed with varying pomp and colour. An epoch-making atmosphere pervaded them all and exposed a new horizon. Young and charming is the Queen, and, with almost complete emergence into modern conception, outlook and thought, it was perhaps a betokening characteristic of ceremonies everywhere that youth was so strongly represented. The late King greatly strengthened the Monarchy, but the Crown may well accrete even deeper symbolic significance. Destiny, dispensing sorrow to all, yet compensates, comforts and blesses and everlastingly beckons. God bless the Queen.

Roughly translated from the somewhat old-fashioned language, the people of Devon celebrated the achievements of the late King, mourned his passing away, but welcomed the accession of a young Queen, who represented the advance of modernity. The Queen more than fulfilled her promise, reigning for 70 years, during which time our country changed profoundly, and not least our parish of Willand, which is physically and socially a very different place to how it was in 1952. However, by the time this magazine reaches you, events will have moved on and we shall be well into the reign of King Charles III. There are as many challenges facing us now as there were 70 years ago, if not more. It is time to look to the future with determination and optimism, and face those challenges. In doing so, we can learn a lot from Willand's past, by examining how the people of Willand worked together and adapted to a changing world. What better way to find out more than to join us at Willand History Group. Our next meeting is on Tuesday, 18 October 2022, at 7pm in The Annex of Willand Village Hall anyone interested would be very welcome.

Despite a damp, rainy evening back in August, several members and guests enjoyed our 'Summer Walk' around the roads and lanes to the north of Willand parish. One of the features we looked at was a site – close to Spratford Stream

that map evidence suggests may once have been a medieval communal meadow connected to the manor of Muxbeare.

It was divided into strips that were owned and managed by those villagers with common rights, and annually allocated to each individual by lot-casting. For half the year such meadows were open to grazing but for the rest of the year they were closed to livestock to allow a crop of hay to grow.

By the nineteenth century the individual strips had fallen into permanent private ownerships and enclosed with hedges. Whilst research is ongoing, it appears that this meadow was called Showley, but also became known as Poorlands, and at least two cottages were built on the plots. One of these cottages was still there in the 1940s, although it not known whether it was inhabited then. The only trace of these cottages that remains visible are two short stretches of dilapidated garden wall within the hedgerow there.

Finally, a recent thunderstorm brought to mind the following report in the local press from 29 June 1905: "Sidney Harris, a little boy, son of Mr Harris, of Coombe Farm, Willand, standing in the courtyard, was struck by lightning during a thunderstorm on Monday afternoon. He fell down, and his head was cut, but fortunately he was not seriously injured.

### **WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL**

What a massive change the events of a few hours can have on all our lives. The date of the 8<sup>th</sup> September 2022 will be remembered as the date of one of those events: the death of Her Majesty the Queen after 70+ years of service and the beginning of the reign of King Charles III.

As I write this to meet the cut-off date for publication, we are mourning the death of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II. We have also witnessed the proclamations for the commencement of the reign of King Charles III. By the time you read this the late Queen's funeral will have taken place and the official period of mourning will have passed. Many of our community will have recognised the changing times by privately or openly dealing with their feelings.

Your Parish and District Council will have followed guidance from a detailed document, prepared and updated over time, known as Operation London Bridge. Following that guidance, within half an hour of the report of the death of Her Majesty your Parish Council had cancelled the scheduled meeting for the Parish Council for that evening. I, as your Parish Council Chairman, together with our Clerk were busy making the arrangements as set out in the guidance. Our village does not have a central focal point such as a village centre and therefore St. Mary's Church sensibly becomes our focal point at times such as this. I liaised with our Vicar, Rev Simon Talbot, and he had already put things in hand. The flag was already at half-mast on the church tower and when the Church opened on the Friday morning a book of condolence was in place for people to write in as they wished. The Church was an obvious place for this as it gave people the opportunity for reflection in a quiet place if they wished. The Church and the Parish websites were updated in accordance with guidance giving information as well as acknowledging the events. Nationally, online facilities were available to make an entry in a Book of Condolence.

It was very hurtful to see that some found it necessary to comment on Facebook to the effect that there was not a flag flying in the Parish and for the Parish Council to show some respect. This is without even bothering to contact a Councillor or the Clerk to ask the question. There is a flagpole on the edge of the Village Hall Car Park. There are no ropes on it and I cannot ever remembers seeing it used as it was vandalised some years ago. On the evening of the 8<sup>th</sup> September a Trustee for the Village Hall and myself had a discussion on site as to the safety and future of the flagpole but first we need to establish 'ownership' and so if anyone knows the answer, I am sure that the Parish Clerk will be pleased to hear from you.

On the subject of showing respect, I can only speak for myself. In 1960 at the age of 16 years I became a Police Cadet in the then Devon Constabulary. In 1963 I became a Police constable, *locally appointed but having Authority under the Crown.* I swore an oath of allegiance to Her Majesty the Queen and I served her and our community for over 30 years until I retired as a Superintendent in 1994. During that time, I was in Her Majesty's presence on a number of occasions when she was in Devon and Cornwall, assisting with her security and



that of her 'subjects'. I am proud to say that I met our new King when he was Duke of Cornwall and Prince of Wales and have seen instances of his caring and kindness. For a number of years, I have done my best to serve our community in Willand as a Parish Councillor and more latterly as a District Councillor for Lower Culm. I have respect for those that earn it or are entitled to it by Act of Parliament.

Whilst on a sad note, on the same day as the death of her Majesty, we were advised of the death of William 'Bill' Tobin. Bill had been a very valued member of the Parish Council for a number of years and only very recently resigned on finding that he had a terminal illness. Bill was a former serviceman who served his Country and community and was also involved with the Composting Group and the Allotments. Our condolences are conveyed to his wife and family on their loss.

Currently we have 10 Parish Councillors with one vacancy for a Co-opted member which has been advertised. We are all volunteers and none of us have been formally elected as not enough 'volunteers' from our community came forward at election time to have an election. In May 2023 there will be an election and due to the increase in the number of voters in Willand it is likely that we will increase to 12 Parish Councillors. If you want to help your community or are not happy with the current Parish Councillors, then please put your name forward so that we have an election and our community can choose who they wish to represent them. Just remember that as hard as you try you cannot please all of the people all of the time and with appointment as a councillor comes responsibility.

I mentioned Facebook earlier and I note that the various sites used in Willand from time to time seem to get very personal and sometimes bordering on offensive. Much comment recently has centred around dogs and the Jubilee Field together with the attitude of a few dog owners. Fact – the whole field is the Subject of a Public Space Protection Order – dogs must be kept on leads. This is in addition to the requirement for dog mess to be picked up and disposed of properly in the village and dog walkers must be in possession of the means to pick up. Just dealing with the Jubilee Field - there are still far too many instances of dogs being seen off leads and some do not appear to be under proper control. Our litter picker is regularly having to pick up dog mess in the field and this is not acceptable particularly when you consider the number of children using the area and the play equipment. The handyman is regularly having to fill in holes dug by dogs and we have had to repair goal posts rusted through. This is costing our community money. Mid Devon District Officers are giving attention to the area and in the main are advising and trying to educate compliance. Sadly at least a couple of people have had to be 'educated' with £100 Fixed Penalty tickets as they did not respond to other methods. Comments on Facebook are more effective if people who witness offences can note the time, date and person responsible and a picture on the mobile telephone is even better.

If this information is passed to MDDC Customer Services by email action will be taken. If you are having difficulty, contact one of your District Councillors. We are all on the telephone and email, details of which are published in this magazine. I live amongst you and Bob Evans holds a monthly Surgery in the Village Hall and so there should be no problem in contacting us.

It is that time of year again where the Parish Council must start preparing a budget for setting the precept for the next financial year. Contracts for grass cutting, hedging and other things need to be agreed and there is no doubt that all costs will rise. Do we cut back on cutting the verges, spraying weeds, cutting the grass in the play areas, cleaning bus shelters etc.? Do we try and maintain our current standards which will mean a rise in the Parish portion of the precept for the Council Tax? Please let our Clerk know if you have any thoughts or come along to a Council Meeting and let your views be known.

With winter coming and the concerns over fuel bills and rising costs, our village groups will be working together to try and help those less fortunate in our community. The Willand Pantry will need help and support; do we try and find a way to open up WHCC at the Gables more often for people to go to and perhaps keep warm and perhaps have warm drinks or soup? It all needs thinking about and coordinating with things that the Churches will be doing. Volunteer helpers will be needed so please do not sit back and think others will do it. Our regular 'volunteers' will need help and support.

With our sadness at the loss of our Queen do not forget to move on and celebrate the commencement of the reign of our new King Charles III. God save the King. Barry G J Warren Chair Willand Parish Council.



### WILLAND COMMUNITY COMPOSTING SCHEME (WCCS).

It's that time of year — yep, it's autumn when the leaves drop down. For your information we accept leaves, **providing** they are not mixed with any other material EXCEPT mown grass. Please deposit in the bay where so directed would be most helpful. Subsequently, the leaves are mown and added to the shredded material for composting. Just a thought you could consider keeping the leaves and lay them on your plant beds — makes good leaf mulch.

### WE ARE GREEN COMPOSTING SITE

'Going green' for WCCS means that we are asking that you only bring green garden waste to the site nothing else. However, after a recent shredding session we discovered glass jars with candles in them. Soil attached to vegetation. And, labels and stones. THIS IS NOT GOOD - bad for the shredder and DON'T COMPOST.

However, we do welcome those who visit and only deposit the garden waste material that is listed on our displayed notices If in doubt please ask us and we will politely tell you where to put it, either here on the site or advise you that we are unable to receive.

### **COMPOST SALES:**

We offer two types of compost: -

**Sieved** (with next to no twigs) compost is £2.00/bag.

PLEASE, returning of your empty bags will be gratefully received.

**Sieved Waste -** this material has been composted then sieved. But because it contains more twigs, we do not offer this as bagged compost. However, we do offer this waste at £1.00/wheelbarrow. We are told by users that when dug in and left to winter it improves the soil quality.

### RECYCLE GARDEN WASTE.

In the meantime, we continue to ask you to recycle garden waste- either, by composting yourself, or, deposit down here at the site. Finally, you could use either, the - MDDC garden waste collection scheme (there is a charge) contact 01884 255255 or deposit at the DCC Ashely Recycling Centre EX16 5PD.

### **DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL**

Can't let this go by without mentioning our late Queen. What a wonderful person and a great Ambassador for our Country and the Commonwealth, perhaps the most famous lady in the World, may she rest in peace.

Having said that, there has not been much activity at County this last August and of course, any meetings in Sept has been postponed because of the mourning period, but those meetings will take place in time, so it is going to be hectic, particularly the build up to preparing for next year's budget, which will be very challenging as you will see below.

At month 4 it is estimated that budgets will overspend by £17 million, excluding the dedicated schools grant deficit. This is made up of an underlying overspend of £35.6 million that is being reduced by £18.6 million of Financial Sustainability Programme (FSP) proposed savings and income. There is also a risk that inflationary pressures could result in costs, in addition to this overspend, of more than £10 million this year. The pandemic and geopolitical situation has created huge financial pressures nationally and the County Council is not immune from that. Immediate action is being taken to safeguard the financial sustainability of the authority. Work is ongoing to identify services and projects in both revenue and capital that can be transformed, modernised, remodelled, funded differently, ceased, or postponed. At month 4 £18.6 million of in year savings and additional income has been identified and work is ongoing at pace to increase this figure and further reduce the forecast overspend.

I thought you might be interested in what is happening in the Devon Housing Market and what the latest data is showing.

- Housing affordability in Devon increased to 10.35 times the average salary in 2021. Around 20% higher than the rest of UK.
- Average house price is £300,000 in Devon. No area of Devon currently has an average house price that would allow a first-time buyer to access 'help to buy' provision of an 'average' dwelling.
- 3,726 new dwellings added to 385,000 stock in 2021 including 600 'affordable homes' (a net gain of 490 after accounting for a loss of 110 through Right to Buy). Against an increase in working population of around 4000.
- At the current rate of net additions to affordable stock, even if we closed housing lists tomorrow, it would still take over 32 years to clear the backlog (reducing to 26.7 years if Right to Buy was scrapped noted to show that while it (RTB) is a significant factor for a number of reasons, it's not the whole story).
- Housing waiting lists numbers increased to 16,058 households by the end of 2021, with 4,500 requiring urgent accommodation. The number of people classified as homeless across Devon increased by 600 last year.
- Private rent stock levels across Devon fell by around 50% between 2019 and 2021.

- The number of housing benefit claimants aged over 70 rose steadily through the year, to 7,000, a 4% increase on the previous year. Only 7 additional supported housing units were however completed in guarter 1 of 2022.
- The number of individuals living in accommodation consider unsanitary, overcrowded or otherwise unsuitable rose to 3,000 by the end of the 2021 across the area. 374 households were in temporary accommodation during Q4 of 21/22, including 70 with children.
- Devon had 11,100 second homes registered during 2021, an increase of around 2% since 2019. In South Hams, second homes made up 8.3% of all housing stock in year. It should be noted however that these official figures may significantly underestimate the real number of homes being used for Airbnb and other purposes.

The Council is committed to becoming an organisation that is intolerant to prejudice and discrimination and helping Devon to be a place that is inclusive, compassionate, and caring, where everyone can feel safe. Progress has been made in response to the findings of the Race Equality Audit report, with actions taken to support colleagues and develop a more inclusive culture. Work will continue to address racism in the workplace and our communities and to improve the protection of staff.

### MID DEVON DISTRICT COUNCIL

At last some good news on the zebra crossing repairs in south view road, this one has taken me many weeks of calls to the CEO's office of the Co-op but you know what they say about patience, the promised time line is ...

- 27 November, trench resettlement work will be undertaken to include refilling, applying a temporary surface and allowing it to settle for a week
- 4 December, the crossing will be properly resurfaced and so will the nearby carriageway
- A third date of 11 December may not be needed but has been included for contingency.
- These are intermittent closures, so the road will be open outside the dates and times specified
- The work is likely to take no more than 4 5 hours each day, and the resurfacing work should hopefully be completed by lunchtime



### **EXCELSIOR ATHLETIC DEVELOPMENT CLUB**

We have started our Autumn term of activities: Gymnastics, Parkour, Weightlifting and our new 'Fit for Sport' class.

Unfortunately, fitness for many children means getting told to do a lot of boring exercises, for a long time: Endless minutes of the plank, dozens of bad pressups, posture-wrecking sit ups. They get tired but don't get any better.

This showed that villagers have some strong views, which we have put together under three headings.

- Willand wants to develop as a safe place that adapts to the future demands of climate change; cares for our natural environment; provides sustainable opportunities in employment, leisure and accommodation; and offers access to education for all generations of the community.
- Willand wants its countryside setting to be protected from overdevelopment and for all villagers to have better access, including by foot and bike, to the rural countryside round about.

We have now put as much of this as we can into a first draft of a Neighbourhood Plan for Willand. This is a plan which would have considerable weight in the planning process by setting out land use planning policies and a strategy for how Willand should change (or not) in the future.

To become an official document Mid Devon District Council will check that it fits within their overall Local Plan; we have to show that it really does represent your views; and then finally it will have to get a majority in a vote of villagers.
