

EDITORIAL No. 160

Spring is here the daffodils snowdrops and primroses are blooming. Time to look forward to the rest of year and enjoy. Look for the word puzzle and what has been going on or about to happen in the village.

WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL CHAIR - COMMENT & REPORT

The year is rushing away before us and as I write this we are into the third month already.

Events in Ukraine are dominating the world news and we in Willand have a diverse make up of resident and/or working population so I am sure we share with all those who are affected directly, or have family in the 'war' region, our best wishes and support. It is having a knock-on effect to us locally with rising electricity and gas prices together with the various fuels for our transport. That then affects food prices and everything else which needs transport. Good argument to buy local wherever possible and support our local businesses.

The Parish and higher tier councils have all set their budgets and although we Parish Councillors had built in a little safeguard against inflation. I am sure our contractors will be seeking some further review of their prices to help with the unexpected increases. This will affect several of our households with their personal fuel bills so please keep an eye on vulnerable neighbours and try and assist them to get advice and help where needed.

Life goes on with planning applications which your Parish Council are consulted on. Planning permission has been given for Phase 2 of the Mid Devon Business Park but now variation to plans applications are being received to cater for the wishes of potential occupiers. We are awaiting the start on the 125 houses off Meadow Park. In anticipation of receipt of the agreed monies the Parish Council is looking at possible plans and contractors to improve the track in the Jubilee Field. There will be some monies over, hopefully, to replace and improve the small 'skateboard' facility. If you or your family have any ideas or interest in improving 'teen' facilities within the village please make yourself known to the Parish Clerk. The more community involvement in the planning of these things the better.

We are aware of consultations to expand Hitchcock Farm Business Park further. There are a number of applications for change of use of buildings around the village. People are seeking permission to fell or trim back protected trees and the Woodland Trust has received permission to carry out major works on the Woodland which will mean the loss of nearly 70 trees through disease. I am sure that they will replant and then if we use the woodland we need to respect and protect the new planting.

One application which is causing a lot of local concern is for the building of a new 'council house' in Barnes Close which will take away six parking spaces. Concerns are expressed concerning the potential to increase 'on street' parking and to restrict access to other properties. These concerns have to be balanced with the provision of needed housing. Residents have contacted me with my

District Council hat on but I have had to explain that as I am a member of the Planning Committee I must not do nor say anything which could be construed as to my having predetermined my position before examining all the facts and hearing argument put before the Planning Committee. You have two other Ward Councillors and I know that Richard Chesterton has met with some.

Speaking of parking, I am aware that parking at the Village Hall is becoming a problem. The Parish Clerk received complaints when Village Hall Trustees recently imposed access restrictions. I have had people approach me from both sides of the argument. I am sure some will say I am dodging the column when I say that it is not a matter for the Parish Council. The Hall is not owned by, nor is it managed by, the Parish Council – it is a separate entity and run by a Board of Trustees who are local volunteers doing their best to provide a very much needed facility in our growing community. I will stick my neck out with a view as a member of our community. If people are parking all day in the car park when they are at work, thus taking up spaces that people renting the village hall need to park in, then we have a problem. If those hiring the hall cannot park, they will not rent the hall and then the hall will not have the necessary money to maintain the building and the car park. We have had one suggestion in the past that we rip out the play equipment in the Jubilee field and make it into a carpark for parents dropping off and collecting children at the school. The Village Hall Trustees do have an understanding with the school which allows the car park to be used for dropping off and picking up. As one who used to have to walk a mile each way in all weathers to get to primary school on Dartmoor back in the early 1950's and parents did not even own a car - Dad had a bicycle - the carpark instead of play suggestion will not get any sympathy from me.

We are regularly getting complaints as to the state of some of the footpaths around the village. Some of the problem is caused by growth from hedgerows and gardens, some is from grass verges or the bottoms of hedges encroaching onto the tarmac thus narrowing the walking area and some is the state of the surface itself. Let me tell you a story. Vegetation growing out from gardens or hedges is the responsibility of the landowner but in some areas, there is no land owner - we have little bits of 'no man's land'. The bottoms of hedges encroaching onto the footpath attract the same responsibilities. If the landowner does not deal with the problem Devon County Highways or the Rights of Way Team can do it and charge the landowner. The surfaces are DCC but you play 'pass the parcel' as to which department does anything. At the end of the day DCC is the first point of call. In the past we used to be able to get the Community Payback Teams to do it but since the management of that service changed, we cannot get them. On the odd occasion MDDC has cleared some areas as growth was coming from 'council house' land. So what do we do? suggestion has been made that as the Parish Council look after the verges, we should take on the footpaths to clear them once a year or so. You all pay through Council Tax although we do get a grant from DCC for the verge cutting. What do you think about the footpaths? At a rough guess it would add about

£1 per household onto the Parish portion of the Council Tax. Please tell the Clerk what you think.

All cannot have failed to notice the digging up of our roads for, in the main, the laying of fibre broadband. BT Open Reach already have cables and fibre but not all are on the best system. Gigaclear has been doing most of the recent digging and they have a contract to cover some roads. Airband also has a contract but they are a while away for their section of the contract. They are interested in picking up areas the others have missed and although there will be a cost involved, they will be interested to hear from people in the more difficult areas who want fast fibre broadband. The better the broadband connections in the area the better for the economy of the area and with more people being able to work from home it will help reduce the carbon footprint. Watch the magazine for flyers to tell you more and we will carry as much information as possible on the Parish Council website and the various Facebook accounts.

We have just held the statutory Parish Meeting but it was a very low key affair as compared to what we have done in the past. Thank you to the village organisations who submitted reports and these will be on the website for all to see. The details of the precept should be in this addition of the magazine and so if you have any concerns or questions please ask.

Covid has not gone away and so please taken sensible precautions to try and prevent the spread and keep our community safe and well.

I wish you all an early Happy Easter, **Barry G J Warren**.

WILLAND VILLAGE HALL First the Good News

At our last trustee meeting, we agreed that we would not increase hire charges this year, because of some of the economic hardships we are all experiencing. However, this was before our Gas supplier went bust and we were transferred to a much more expensive one. Our gas bills for the past few months have been around £1000, well over double the amount we have paid before. To help us conserve fuel, please make sure that you keep all the exterior doors closed when the heating is on.

Some of you may not be aware that the Village Hall is NOT owned by the Parish Council or the School. It is run by trustees, who are volunteers and give their time, free of charge, to ensure the Hall is kept in good repair and utilised by as many people as possible. The trustees have to charge for its use, as they are responsible for raising all the money to keep it in good repair and we receive no support from the Government, MDDC or the Parish Council.

We have had a few problems recently. The Village Hall car park is not a public car park. The trustees allow parents to use the car park to drop off and pick up children from school in order to keep the children safe and away from the busy roads. Some of our users have complained that they have been unable to park and have talked about stopping classes because they have been unable to find parking space during the day as some school staff and other people not using the hall have taken up the spaces. If unauthorised users continue to park in our car park, we may have to take action to keep our users happy. We do not want to have to lock the gates to protect our hirers, but we cannot allow this situation to continue. Please help us by not parking in the car park unless you are either attending an event at the Hall or if you are dropping off or picking up your children at the beginning and end of the school day.

WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL PRECEPT 2022-2023

This is the precept requested by Willand Parish Council for the year April 2022 to March 2023. The Parish Council carefully considered the current income and expenditure which enables it to do the things it has to do within the Parish and those that improve the village for everyone. The Parish Council has also been mindful to keep any necessary increases to a minimum which, due to there being a few more houses in the village since last year, has resulted in a 1% reduction in the Band D Parish Charge.

The income figures are based very much on the actuals from this year. The project line reflects generous donations from local businesses towards the Christmas lights. Money has been secured from Devon County Council towards the cost of verge cutting and grant funding was obtained towards weed spraying, but the grant funding cannot be budgeted for in 2022-2023. You may notice that income from the cemetery has increased this year but it is not possible to accurately predict income from the cemetery although the maintenance costs are ongoing.

Contracts are ongoing for all the ground maintenance within the village and the figures reflect these contracts.

Moving somewhat closer to home, I've recently dealt with a couple of issues that related to elderly or in one case a vulnerable individual who via family and friends were looking for help in knowing their loved ones were safe or if the worst happened could summon help quickly.

I'm not a salesman but I have been a little surprised at how many people do not know of a service that MDDC can provide via- **lifeline**, I'm not going to try and sell anybody anything, but hope that one or two may find the article below helpful for their relatives or friends or may simply pass it in to somebody they feel may benefit.

The following can be found on the MDDC web site and is a direct lift from those pages.

Lifeline alarms



A Lifeline alarm provides help at the touch of a button 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The service provides peace of mind to people who feel at risk in their own homes. It gives people the freedom to live their life independently knowing that they can obtain assistance when they need it.

The technology consists of an alarm unit connected to the telephone line and a button to call for assistance if:

- you have become immobile or incapacitated;
- your security is being threatened or,
- you are suffering from a medical emergency.

The alarm is also supplied with a wireless pendant worn around the neck or wrist allowing help to be summoned from anywhere around your house or garden.

Calls for assistance are answered by specially trained staff who will immediately contact family members, friends or neighbours nominated by you for help. In the case of a medical emergency, the appropriate emergency service will also be called. This service is available to anyone living in Mid Devon. We charge a one-off installation fee of £30.00 and £45.12 per quarter thereafter. If you would like us to visit you and show you how the lifeline works, please **Contact us for more information**. **Lifeline@middevon.gov.uk**

Prerequisites for Lifeline alarms

The Lifeline alarm service is available to everyone in Mid Devon. However, you will need to have a telephone socket with an active landline near a three pin electrical socket.

We also offer additional bespoke packages to assist lifeline users with other needs such as

- Key safes
- Big button phones
- Bogus caller buttons
- Fall detectors
- Flood detectors
- Fashion watch with alarm compatibility
- Mobile alarm
- Safe socket
- Smoke detector
- Temperature detector
- Wireless Carbon Monoxide

Finally, I continue to be very proud that having made a promise not just to the residents of Lower Culm but all residents of Mid Devon that I would do all I can within my Cabinet portfolio not just talk about but bring about more social housing, only yesterday saw the second modular housing project passed by the MDDC planning committee, I'm hoping this is only the the start and I am looking to have a different project nearly every month presented for committees consideration at sites throughout Mid Devon.

Other entertainments that day included a fun fair, a Carnival Dance at the Village Hall, and a popular children's fancy dress contest, won by Louise Overy and Richard Penberthy as 'The Hippies'. On the same front page, under the headline 'New Town in Uffculme and Willand Area?', it was reported how the latest Devon County Council planning analysis had highlighted 'Uffculme-Willand' as the most suitable site to build a satellite town for Exeter 'with a target [population] intake of 30,000 by 2010'!!

In February, several History Group members enjoyed a visit to the Culm Valley Model Railway Club's open day (in their room at The Old Well, Waterloo Cross), and were impressed by their model of Tiverton Junction. The old railway station and its surrounds are recreated in incredible detail, including features such as the Railway Hotel (demolished when the M5 was built c.1975), and Park Farm (now Stoneman Engineering). The model is still a work in progress, but it really evokes a bygone era, circa the 1950s /60s, when Willand had its own railway station (finally closed in 1986).

We would also like to thank Richard Penberthy (see 'The Hippies' above) for sending us some of his memories of growing up in Willand during the 1960s and '70s. He recalls the area around the railway station at a time just before the M5 was built: "There was a slip road where the roundabout is that was the entrance to Platform 2 of Tiverton Junction Station, and the goods yard. I remember it well as we used to mess about in there. There was a large sandstone grinding wheel in the yard. We would take it in turns turning the handle while the other would sharpen his sheath knife which we all carried. Just before the railway bridge was a very large advertising board and hidden around

PALMERS BRIDGE, STATION ROAD, CULLOMPTON, DEVON EX15 1BQ

the back of it was an abandoned motor scooter. On the other side of the bridge was [Park] farm and halfway up the bank on the right were steps to the station car park. The railings can still be seen today. Where the motorway bridge now stands was the slip road to the station, Railway Inn, a row of cottages (which went parallel to the railway line and as far up as the scrap metal dealers) and Assembly Rooms. These were all boarded up before work on the motorway started. We managed to break in to most of the cottages and make them into dens. I can't remember ever getting into the pub though. Further up the road was the market. If it was raining we played 5-a-side football in one of the sheds using the large sliding double doors as goals. The opposite side of the road was fields all the way to the Halfway House and Muxbeare. In the fields was where the annual fairground went. Next to Aggie Weston's chip shop, which is still there, was Salter's stores; One Stop was Lloyd Maunder's butchers, and right on the corner was Broome's shop which also had a haberdashery department. Between Park Street and the top of Maunder's lane and the start of 'Round the World' was a large bank running alongside the road. Walking Round the World on the first corner before another railway bridge was a huge tree that just about everyone carved their name on. At the other end of Round the World, at the top of Dean Hill Road, were more houses which were all boarded up and a large tree with a seat around the base [Willand's Jubilee Tree planted for Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee in 1887]. The only house to remain up was the one next to Charlie Goff's garage which was taken down brick by brick and re-built away from the motorway. It was guite a harsh winter that year and we would borrow trays from Goff's café and use them to slide down the embankment."
