WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL CHAIR - COMMENT & REPORT

Christmas has been and gone and we are nearly halfway through January 2022 as I write this. I hope that you all managed to enjoy Christmas in one form or another. My wife and I made it to Wales to join our daughter and her family this year and so that was a nice change. For those of you who were alone for one reason or another let us hope that as the year progresses circumstances will change for the better. If you are alone there are organisations within the village who can help. You only have to ask. We are keeping the Parish Helpline [01884 35455] active although it is little used at the moment.

The Christmas lights were on display in the village again this year and the cost to the Parish was reduced as the result of generous donations from local companies and organisations. They are:

Pall-Ex South West PenCarrie

On behalf of the Parish and its residents I express our sincere thanks to you all.

The Parish Council meet on the second Thursday of the month and our agenda and minutes appear on the notice boards around the village and on the Website. At our January meeting a new Parish Councillor, Mr Nick Bartlett was co-opted. Nick used to be a Parish Councillor some time back but had to step down for business reason. He will be a welcome asset on his return.

We are in the process of finalising the budget for the Parish which will allow the District Council to set the precept for our portion of the Council Tax. We have tried to be prudent and still maintain our standard of service for the work we carry out in keeping our Village looking clean and tidy. Inflation is affecting all our contractors prices and there is also a wage rise being negotiated for local authority worker. If all goes to plan the Parish portion of your council tax will still be a few pence over £1 per week and our projected rise will be about 2p per week for each Band D house (proportionate for other bands). What DCC, MDDC, Fire Authority and Police and Crime Commissioner do we have no control over.

You will note that there are new signs around the village on the play areas and some of the public open spaces which have play equipment in them. This is as the result of Mid Devon District Council [MDDC] making a Public Space Protection Order [PSPO] for the control of dogs in relevant areas. There was a full public consultation and this is as the result. The signs are self explanatory and set out all the details. Please make sure that you read them if you are a dog owner/walker as non-compliance could lead to owners/walkers receiving a fixed penalty notice. If they are not paid then a Court case could be a lot more costly.

Approval has been given for the 125 houses to be built off Meadow Park. The Parish Council, and me with my District Council Planning Committee member hat on, tried to get some improvements made and also proper protection of trees and the like but we were getting little progress. Of the 11 members on the Planning Committee only 3 voted in favour of approval, 2 voted against and the other six members, of whom I was one, abstained as we felt there was insufficient detailed information and safeguards to give approval at that time. Hopefully there should be financial benefits to the village for improvement at the Primary School [DCC Education to receive £250,000]; £125,000 to the Parish Council to provide 'teenager' facilities - BMX/Skate facilities: £52,500 towards the Gables site of Willand Health & Community Centre and £100,000 towards improving public transport. There should also be the widening of the narrow section of the footpath along Silver Street by the woods which will hopefully make it a bit safer for residents of Ash Close and Rowan Lea taking children to and from school. There will be a footpath connecting to the new site as well. All of these benefits were fought for in negotiations in 2018 by myself, as Parish Council Chairman, Richard Chesterton and Bob Evans as District Councillors and Ray Radford as County Councillor. You can rest assured that we will continue to work as a team to see that it happens. The Parish Council, together with help from interested residents, will be watching the developers to ensure that they comply with conditions to protect the trees, maintain the public footpath and ensure that construction traffic causes as little disruption as possible.

MDDC is reviewing the Parish Boundaries following on from the Boundary Commission report on District Council Ward Boundaries. Willand and Uffculme Parish Councils have been making representations to have the area of Halberton Parish to the East of the M5 shared between their two Parishes as the developments at Hitchcocks Farm, Mid Devon Business Park, Langlands Business Park, and the new housing now at Lucombe Park have more effect on Willand and Uffculme than they do on Halberton. The committee does include Councillor Richard Chesterton who is one of our Lower Culm Ward Councillors so make sure that he is aware of your views and you can of course respond to the consultation yourselves via the MDDC website. Our DCC Councillor Ray Radford is also on the committee but as he is the Ward Councillor for Halberton on MDDC and I am sure he will be 'batting' for the Halberton view. If you do not make your voice heard there is no point in complaining about it afterwards.

Please continue to participate in village groups and functions. Please look after your hedges and gardens and make sure that they do not interfere with the wellbeing of others. We hope to see some form of celebration in the village for the forthcoming Jubilee so please look at the posts and information from the group(s) organising any event(s).

Don't forget your Councillors and Clerk are only at the end of an email or telephone if you need help or advice. Barry G J Warren

WILLAND COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH (WCSW)

By the time villagers read this, we may well have launched WCSW.

And, it is badly needed according to the latest data from the VAS box on Silver Street (data kindly supplied by Parish Councillor Paul Major). Between 1 and 31 December, a total of 8,049 vehicles travelled at 35mph or above along Silver Street in the direction towards the Co-op, Would you believe 2 vehicles were clocked at between 70 and 75mph? 61 vehicles were between 50 and 75mph.

The volunteer team have been waiting since October for the local police team to process the paperwork to approve the sites where the volunteer team propose to stand. I hasten to add that this is not the fault of local PC, Adrian Legg, who is very supportive of **WCSW** but, is down to the lack of resource in our local police team.

However, really good news - Devon & Cornwall Police have now invested in the **CSW** central team and have recently recruited 2 enforcement officers (one for each county). I met with both of them on 11 January and we all walked the village to look at our proposed sites, which were agreed, and the officers have committed to process the paperwork by the end of this week.

So, fingers crossed, we will go live by the end of January and I will post the definite go live date on WoW when it is confirmed. Please watch your speed in the village - we want to deter people, not catch them.



MID DEVON DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT

There are a couple of local issues I want to make a comment on as I'm sure they will be forming parts of some conversations as you read this.

Firstly: the planning application for 125 dwellings that is adjacent to Meadow Park and Silver Street is still receiving comments on social media, some quite frankly are a little alarming. Why anyone thinks it's OK to trot out the now very old and dated quote on "brown envelopes" Seriously?

As a reminder the original application was refused by MDDC Planning Committee, the developer won their permission via an Appeal and an Inspectors decision. At the early January Planning Committee meeting the development was on the agenda for Reserved Matters approval. I would agree the meeting was a very strange affair - I watched via Zoom. Committee members were

seemingly attempting to alter what had already been agreed which wasn't the way to go. I have never witnessed a vote such as this – three for, two against and six abstaining. As I have said the application was already agreed via an appeal and the dwellings will be built.

There seemed to be further confusion as questions were asked around the Section 106 Agreements and the early release of money for some schemes. For the sake of clarity: The Section 106 Agreements are binding. The possible early release of money for the school project is something that was negotiated separately by myself and others. This agreement is with Devon County Council Officers NOT the developer.

Secondly, I would like to make a request please:

I understand there is some disquiet amongst Willand residents on empty council owned properties. I have not received any of these queries myself, some reach me via Parish Council Members. As Cabinet Member for Housing and Property Services I am best placed to help with any queries you may have. My contact details are at the end of this article.

There are many reasons why a property can be empty for weeks and sometimes months. The pandemic obviously has an effect, Mid Devon staff are not immune from the effects and restrictions of Covid-19. Some instances are complex and require the intervention of the Court; some properties need work to be undertaken prior to being reallocated – this can range from a simple decorating job to new kitchens or major structural work.

My teams are also undertaking a programme of extensive decarbonisation. You will be aware of the Net Zero Carbon Emissions target. A good time for much of this work to be undertaken is when a property becomes vacant. Decarbonisation requires a far greater time to complete but is vital in trying to meet our targets.

All work costs money and we always seek to do things in the most cost-effective way. We have to balance leaving a property empty (and reducing rent income) against moving someone into a property and back out again. This can raise the cost by many thousands of pounds given the council must cover all the moving costs/resettling and out of pocket expenses.

In conclusion what may be seen as simply an empty house, flat or bungalow always has an agreed plan and we are always looking to get any property back in use as soon as possible in the most cost-effective way.

Moving on to the immediate and future plans for Housing. I acknowledge the need for more social and affordable housing which is exactly the reason I have introduced an extensive modular home building programme planned for the next five years – Providing much needed homes for local families.

By the time you read this I hope that we will have at least two planning applications agreed and have received further correspondence from Homes England who myself and my team are talking to on grant funding.

On a personal note and something that is important for me to reiterate here. I am an experienced Senior Manager, having spent decades in the demanding world of service industry. In my time as an MDDC Councillor I have found our officers are amongst the most dedicated and professional I have worked with. Some unfortunate comments made sadly even by Members do them a great injustice and one I am happy to counter.

DCC COUNTY COUNCILLOR REPORT JANUARY 2022

This time of year sees all Authorities struggling with the budgets. Currently and we have a few more months to go, we are over budget, this is not unusual at this point during the year. We have always brought it back in line by the end of the year and we will do the same this year. We do not want to dip into our reserves. By law we have to produce a balanced budget.

This report outlines the financial position and forecast for the Authority at month 9 (to the end of December) of the financial year. At month 9 it is estimated that budgets will overspend by just over £8.3 million, an increase of £1.3 million from month 6. The Dedicated Schools Grant projected deficit, relating to Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), is forecast to be £39.0 million. In line with Department of Education guidance this deficit will not be dealt with this financial year but carried to future years. Central government has continued to provide a number of grant funding streams this year to help support Local Authorities during the pandemic. The confirmed additional funding Devon County Council is expecting to receive directly this financial year is currently £50.7 million, in addition to the £25.6 million carried forward from 2020/21. Adult Care and Health services are forecast to overspend by just over £5.1 million, a reduction of £71,000 from month This position includes £3.2 million of budgeted savings. Adult Care Operations is forecasting to overspend by just under £5.4 million, this is a mix of price and volume pressures. Within Learning Disabilities and Autism higher demand has continued into this year with client numbers in these areas being 142 more than the budgeted level of 3,569. Older People is also experiencing significant pressures, mainly due to price pressures on residential and increase in the number of nursing placements which are 36 more than the budgeted level of 516. Adult Commissioning and Health and Mental Health is forecast to underspend by £230,000. Revenue Expenditure Children's Services are forecasting an over spend of £9.1 million an increase of £1.8 million from month 6. However, this figure does not include the projected deficit of £39.1 million on Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

Part of my duty is to serve on the Devon & Somerset Fire & Rescue Service (DSFRA). I thought you might like to know what they have been up to during the pandemic crisis. Firefighters from across the five south west fire and rescue services are to continue to provide vital life-saving support alongside the ambulance service. Since the early stages of the pandemic, firefighters have been working with ambulance crews from South Western Ambulance Service (SWASFT) to assist during medical emergencies. The partnership has led to countless lives being saved and received praise from government and royalty. The shared crews have so far attended in excess of 30,000 calls, more than half of which are within the highest two priority calls, which are to people in lifethreatening or serious conditions. With the current winter pressures on the NHS and surge in Omicron cases, this arrangement has been extended and will now continue until April 2022. Strong partnerships between fire and ambulance services aren't new. Fire crews are often called upon to gain entry to houses so

that paramedics can see to patients and some fire stations have staff who are trained to give basic life support to people until the arrival of an emergency ambulance. Under the agreement, fire officers will continue to work alongside ambulance staff by driving vehicles and assisting clinicians to provide patient-focused care. Lee Howell, Chief Fire Officer of Devon and Somerset Fire and Rescue Service, said: ""I couldn't be more proud of the firefighters who when the call came, put their hands up to step outside of their normal duties and come to aid of our partners and our communities. Their dedication, selflessness, and resolve has been, and continues to be, exceptional."

In adult social care in Devon right now:

We currently serve around 11,000 people and the majority of our spend is on working age adults. We commission 34,000 hours of personal care each week in people's homes and the same amount again of enabling care helping to promote people's independence. We are supporting over 100 more-older people in nursing care from last year which may be reflective of increasing complexity of need. We are seeing unprecedented requests for care, and when we receive those requests they are from increasingly poorly people, with increasingly complex needs, that requires complex care from more people. We continue to struggle to meet assessed need for personal care and in any week we have around 6,000 hours of care that we are unable to supply. This relates to approximately 460 people who will have their needs met in a different way including extra support from family members, other voluntary sector services or some other support to keep people safe. Nobody is left without some support and teams are constantly monitoring the risk and targeting the care we can source to the most needy and urgent cases. Alongside the growing requests is a stretched workforce, between Aug to Oct 2021 there were 3081 care worker vacancies, a rise of 86% on the same period in 2019. The supply of staff is extremely challenging and putting a huge strain on those in the caring workforce. Nurse shortages in nursing homes is leading to some homes having to cancel their registration to provide nursing care.

I am hoping very much that the majority of the disruptions caused by Gigaclear installing broadband in our area has decreased somewhat. Nevertheless, we have set up a working group to investigate what really is going on, particularly the harder to reach areas. I believe what is happening is broadband providers are cherry picking and the harder to reach areas are suffering, we intent to find out.

Because of Covid-19 I have not been able to attend Parish Council meetings as I would have liked, it is worse now than it ever has been, I hope this will improve as the omicron virus recedes, I hope. Why do people say "slept like a baby" when babies wake every two hours and cry?

WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

Back in December, the History Group held another successful meeting. Amongst many items discussed, it was decided that rather than holding meetings on an ad hoc basis, they should be fixed on the third Tuesday of every other month. Our next meeting, therefore, will be on Tuesday, 15 February 2022, at 7.00pm in The Annex room of Willand Village Hall. We are keen to get more people involved, you don't need to be a member, but you would be more than welcome to come along and see what we we're up to – or feel free to get in touch for more information.

In parallel with Devon History Society's 'Devon in the 1920s' project, research has been started into Willand and district during the 1920s, placing what happened here into the broader county and national context - covering topics such as agriculture, housing, transport and 'rural life'. For example, one subject is the 'decline' of big country estates – for various reasons large portions, if not whole estates, were sold after the First World War, often being outlying farms that were bought by the sitting tenants. In this context will be looking at the March 1919 sale of a significant part of the nearby Bradfield estate, owned by the Walrond family, under whose sphere of influence Willand effectively fell. A total of 1,840 acres was sold off over several parishes and including ten farm holdings, one of which was Dye House farm in Willand. Consisting of 105 acres, Dye House was described in the sale catalogue as a 'very rich & productive farm' with 'a large and convenient farmhouse' with farm buildings, yard and two tied cottages. The estate auction was held at the Palmerston Hotel in Tiverton on 6 March 1919, and Dye House was bought by Willand farmer, William Rowe, who lived at The Elms, in Willand 'old village', and who had been renting Dye House since at least 1914. If you're interested in helping with such research. please get in touch, or you would be welcome at our next meeting.

We have also been planning for our 2022 Exhibition, scheduled for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee weekend, 2-5 June, although we await to see how plans for Willand's community celebrations crystallise before fixing the finer details. As well as looking at Willand in the 1950s, and the changes that have occurred in the parish over the last 70 years, we hope to display some of the posters, programmes and photos from the Willand's 1953 Coronation celebrations, as well as for the Jubilees in 1977, 2002 and 2012. Do you have any photos from any of these events? We only have a few from the Jubilees, and none from the Coronation. Any photos would be copied and returned, and of course appropriate accreditation would be given if they are used in the exhibition.

For example, does anyone have any memories or photos of Willand's Silver Jubilee celebrations in 1977? There were official community events organised across the Jubilee weekend, including a children's fancy dress parade (from Townlands to the school), church services, a sports and fete, barbeques, dances and discos. I was present in the Village Hall on the Monday of that Jubilee weekend to receive one of the Jubilee mugs presented to the children of the parish. I can't remember much, though, as I was only ten days old, the

A belated Happy New Year to you all from the Composters!

These Times are COVID dependent – if we have to close – notices will be displayed.

A reminder that the material we accept is listed and displayed on the gates but if you still have a Christmas tree we can accept it providing all decorations are removed and the trunk and branches are no more than 1" in diameter.

We don't accept - Cordyline or palm leaves as they do not compost down and cause havoc in the shredding process.

We have been receiving an inordinate number of stones mixed in the leaves that have been deposited with us. Our normal process is that we use a lawnmower to chop up the leaves so that they compost faster. We have experienced damage to our machinery and some near misses with personal injury, caused by stones. Can we ask that some care is taken to ensure that stones are not mixed in the leaves that are deposited.

COMPOST SALES:

We offer two types of compost: -

Sieved (with next to no twigs) compost is £2.00/bag.

Sieved Waste - this material has been composted then sieved. But because it contains more twigs, we do not offer this as bagged compost. However, we do offer this waste at £1.00/wheelbarrow. We are told by users
