



#### WILLAND COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH (WCSW)

I'm afraid the team haven't been out since the last update due to a combination of sickness, bad weather and going dark early. The winter months are typically the time for planning the next 12 months' objectives and activities, which we have been doing.

However, there is a ray of sunshine - December's data from the VAS box on Silver Street is the first month that we can compare with the same month a year ago and, the signs are very promising: -

The number of speeding vehicles in Dec '22 was significantly down on Dec '21 (-20%), even though total vehicles were up (+7.7%). The no of speeders as a % of total vehicles was down from 6.7% to 4.9%.

The average speeders per day dropped from 520 to 414.

However, 414 is still way too many and, 37 were doing 50+ mph. Further, there was even 2 doing 65-70mph!! So, a big thank you to those drivers keeping to the speed limit and, to those still exceeding it, the WCSW team will soon be out in force on every road of concern in Willand.

As always, we would rather persuade drivers to stick to the speed limit than catch them. **David Marrow, Group Co-ordinator, WCSW**

#### WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL

Times – they are a changing - yet on the other hand some things never seem to change. Let us hope that the following notes clarify what is happening, or not happening, around our Parish.

The Christmas lights have been and are now gone. Sincere thanks to all those local businesses and organisations who supported offsetting some of the cost with generous donations. The recognition has been posted on our website and you may well find an entry in this copy of the magazine. What do we do next year as 2023 is the last year of our current contract? Do we renew the contract, do something different or nothing at all? Balancing budgets come into it and it is getting now that replacing and maintaining timers is becoming more expensive than leaving the lights on all of the time. Arguing against that is climate change and reducing the carbon footprint and not using more electricity than is necessary. Decisions will have to be made and your Parish Councillors will appreciate feedback from our community as to what you would like done. It may be that we write to all organisations within the village asking for feedback. That is not to say individuals cannot or should not respond as we need all the views possible, please.

On the subject of climate change things are moving on in respect of solar farms to produce electricity. In my last notes I mentioned the possibility of a planning application being submitted for another solar farm in or around the village. That application has now been submitted for a solar farm of over 150 acres in size and over 80% of the land is Grade 2 or 3a agricultural land which is suitable for growing crops and food. Have a look on the Mid Devon District Website under reference 22/02272/FULL and you will see all the relevant documents. By the time you read this it may be close to the closing date for public comment but as this is such a major change to our countryside, I am sure you will be able to comment for a bit longer. The planning officers and the planning committee members need the views of our residents whether they support or object to the application. Please make your views known.

You will note that we are due for a change of magazine Editor as Gerri Taylor feels that the time has come for her to retire. She is supported by a small team of volunteers and if we are to continue with the magazine, we need a new Editor and the support of the team of distributors etc. Responses are a bit slow at the moment. Do you want a magazine to continue? If not how else are the various organisations in the village going to have a voice and share information with us all. Please let us know what you would like for the future.

Our volunteers have kindly sorted out the planting for the various beds but you may realise that something different is happening at the Gables corner bed. Our Tiny Tots Group are trying it out as a bit of a 'community bed' for them so it will be interesting to see what they achieve. The Old Well Garden Centre again supported us with a generous discount on the plants and the compost group provided some more compost as needed. Thank you all.

The contracts have been let for grass and hedge trimming around the areas of the village which the Parish Council look after. We will still have the same contractor maintaining the Jubilee Field and Orchard Way area. The grass verges are being taken over by another company who put in a more competitive price but are conversant with similar work in other council areas. Weed spraying will be carried out by another company altogether. The Clerk will be interested in receiving any feedback from residents as to the performance of the contractors as they have all had to put their prices up to reflect the increasing costs, we are all facing.

The precept for next year is being finalised as I write this and the detail will appear elsewhere in the magazine. It is going to go up and the initial figure was a potential 33% rise for the Parish element of the precept just to stand still. We have done some 'tweaking' and used some reserves (not an ideal solution but needs must) and we have got it down by 10% or so. Regrettably all the other organisations which draw on the council tax will be having a percentage rise. MDDC are trying to keep their figures down by asking Parish and Town Councils to contribute towards some of their costs. Willand Parish Council has yet to consider this at the time of writing.

On a sad note, Barbara our Parish Clerk, leaves us at the end of February. Hopefully things are well in hand to find a replacement and the email address and contact telephone number will be the same. Many thanks are due to Barbara, and Graham her husband, for all the work they have put in during her time in office.

Do not forget we have elections for District Councillors (3) and Parish Councillors (12) in May 2023 so if you are interested in helping your community, please consider putting your name forward. Some of the current members may not wish to continue so we need to be prepared. Whatever you do please make sure you vote for your preferred councillors as it is no good moaning about what is going on if you did not take your opportunity to affect the future.





#### WILLAND PARISH COUNCIL PRECEPT 2023 - 2024

This is the precept requested by Willand Parish Council for the year April 2023 to March 2024. The Parish Council carefully considered the current income and expenditure which enables it to do the things it has to do within the Parish and those that improve the village for everyone. The Parish Council has used some reserves to reduce the potential percentage rise which has resulted in a 20% increase in the Band D Parish Charge.

The income figures are based very much on the actuals from this year. The project line reflects generous donations from local businesses towards the Christmas lights. Money has been secured from Devon County Council towards the cost of verge cutting and grant funding was obtained towards weed spraying, but the grant funding cannot be budgeted for in 2023-2024. New contracts have been negotiated for the different aspects of ground maintenance within the village and the figures reflect these contracts.



On the 1st December members were invited to attended an Extraordinary Full Council meeting, the sole purpose of which was to vote on the recommendations of the cross-party committee of 12 members that discussed the Mid Devon Area Parish Boundary Review. The process had taken in public consultations and the committee had discussed a range of issues from all Wards that were considering changes.

As a member if this committee I wrote back in November that some 70% of the time had been used to discuss the range of possible changes for "our ward, Lower Culm" and that of Halberton. Following many hours of debate a recommendation was unanimously passed by all those present at the final committee meeting. These recommendations were in line with the vast majority of comments received from you the public.

Therefore, you will now see my anger and disappointment that at the Extraordinary Full Council meeting on 1st December that a quarter of elected members did not attend for such an important vote. This gave the opportunity for a last-minute amendment to be tabled by a neighbouring ward member that sought to undermine both the public and committee recommendations.

It is of even greater disappointment that this amendment was then supported by a political block vote of the member by group members that represent areas well away from ours.

They voted to reject the recommendations and public comments to pass a version that leaves our ward ever reliant on the actions and interventions of a set of Parish Councillors that live many miles away and are never affected by planning decisions made on land that sits adjacent to your homes.

There is also a well-documented history of them making no or very limited comments on such applications, thus failing to protect Lower Culm residents from unwanted development.

This is the worst face of the political manipulation, now increasingly being seen to be playing out, in this an election year.

For myself and those of you that had taken the time to write in and comment I was and am still angry at such a cynical political move.

All councils have a members pay reviewed each year; this is undertaken by an independent panel that look at a number of factors. They talk to members, look

at workload, consider neighbouring council's members pay and make a recommendation set against these and other considerations.

This year saw a recommendation of a 4.04% rise in the basic allowance, for information this is currently £5494.68 per annum.

In addition, there are a range of special responsibility allowances e.g., the Leader of the Council received the basic allowance plus another 3x so a total of £21,978.72, Cabinet Members receive basic plus an additional 1.5 x, and Chairs of Committees receive additional allowances, full details of these payments are on the MDDC website.

It is frustrating that all councils pay different amounts, a universal payment/ allowance would save a deal of time. It would also be helpful if any award was set by Central Government and not requiring Councillors to debate and vote on their own pay.

As stated, we are entering an election year so all this did this was create a platform for political postering.

Firstly, The Leader sought an increase in excess of 6% well above the Panel's recommendation. This was supported by one political group but opposed by another.

We then entered a farcical round of votes that saw two recommendations rejected and even worse saw some members vote for both!

Full disclosure here: I tabled a motion to agree the 4.04%, as recommended. This surprisingly saw the same member who had seconded the 6% pay award now second my motion? Then saw him desperately trying to get his group to vote for my motion. Unfortunately, as this group had already agreed they were doing something different the confusion was evident and my motion was lost.

The same happened with the Leaders motion, despite having support of one political group the remaining councillors voted against the higher award. There ensued a raft of politically based verbal exchanges, resulting in a total stalemate. You couldn't make it up. The conclusion? To adjourn the vote until February.

The fact is, any increase will be not come into force until after the May elections. Of those pontificating on political grounds some are not standing and some that do may not actually get elected. I intend to table a compromise motion in February - watch this space.

Yet Another example of political groups concentrating on their agendas NOT council business.

Many will know I have for several months (or is it years?) been attempting to get a round table discussion to bring forward radical thinking on a new restoration plan for the vast area of local quarry sites that are coming to the end of their productive life. The current restoration plans were formed in the 1940's

#### WILLAND HISTORY GROUP

There is very little to report from the History Group, other than that planning continues towards an exhibition and community event at the Village Hall on Saturday, 6 May 2023, to mark the King's Coronation, possibly with a 'live screening' of the event itself. Hopefully, by the time this magazine comes out, we should have a clearer idea of what is happening, and details will be advertised via lamppost, or social media post.

Ongoing research into Bradfield House and Estate has revealed an interesting incident from January 1909 which sheds light on the lives our local politicians at that time. Our local (Conservative) MP was then the aristocratic Lionel Walrond, who lived at Bradfield with his glamorous, and very wealthy wife, Charlotte, known as 'Lottie'. In January 1909, with a general election looming, Lionel was on the campaign trail with his wife and had attended a meeting at Thorverton, from where he went on to a ball at the County Hall in Exeter. It had been the intention for them all to return to Bradfield, but Lottie was tired, and so booked into New London Inn in Exeter. Lionel, however, set out in the early hours (about 5am) in Lionel's motorcar (a limousine 28hp Daimler, a wedding present from Lottie's uncle, said to be worth £1,000), which was driven by his chauffeur, Joseph Orr.

On their way out of Exeter the car hit an electric tramway standard. Lionel went through the plate glass partition between the 'body of the car and the chauffeur's seat'. He suffered cuts to his face and hands, small artery was cut on his neck, with considerable blood loss, plus bruising all over his body. The chauffeur's head went through the glass screen at the front of the car, he was thrown onto the road, but apart from a bad cut over his left eye, other cuts and bruising, and was just left badly shaken. A doctor who lived nearby attended the scene and the injured were taken to New London Inn. Later they were taken back to Bradfield and treated by Willand's renowned doctor, Dr Tracey of The Gables. The police officers who attended the accident confirmed that 'the chauffeur was sober' and that the motorcar was 'wrecked'.

While Lionel's immediate political appointments were cancelled, Lottie announced that she intended to attend meetings in his stead where possible, and that same day attended a Primrose League (Conservative) meeting at the Tiverton Junction Assembly Room, in Willand (this Assembly Room was on Station Road next to the Railway Hotel, both knocked down when the M5 was built). It was reported that she '... pluckily came up from Exeter in a hired car, presided at the meeting, delivered a pointed little speech, and contributed (counting encores) no fewer than five sprightly songs in the entertainment part'. Dr Tracey, one of Lionel's ardent supporters, also spoke at the meeting, describing how they had been 'under a cloud and endured terrible anxiety', but thankfully, despite serious injury and rumours that he was close to death, Lionel was not 'dangerously ill', and adding that 'after this meeting came to an end, she [Lottie] would again take her seat in that motor car and hurry back to far-off Exeter to wait upon her suffering husband. (Cheers.)' It was estimated that around 200 people were present for the musical programme, making the venue too crowded for dancing. One of the songs Lottie sang was 'The Wedding o' Sandy Macnab', made famous by music hall legend, Harry Lauder. When she left, the entire audience came out into the road to sing 'For she's a jolly good lady'. James Morrison, 01884 250057 (jamorrison235@gmail.com)
