

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

We are moving fast to the end of another year which will be full of memories for most of us. Some sad but hopefully most of them will be positive and happy.

I had the honour to attend the Remembrance Service at the War Memorial in Willand Parish Churchyard on the 10th of November. I was joined by our Vice Chairman, Richard Phare with Councillor Stephen Little officiating as vicar at the War Memorial and another councillor Sue Leach had organised the display of poppies around the area. It was pleasing to see so many from the community in attendance and the support from the Scouts, Guides, Brownies and is all really heartening for the future. Their participation in reading the lesson and leading prayers was a tribute to them all. The weather was kind to us and the Churchwardens and other organisers are to be congratulated. The live organ playing was also a bonus. Thank you all.

All monies for planned improvements to some of our play areas has been released by the District Council and orders have been placed. Hopefully we may see the new goal posts in the Jubilee Field before Christmas. In the New Year there will be some changes in the Jubilee Field fenced play area and also at Chestnut Drive. The biggest change will be in Orchard Way with new monkey bars and bucket swing and quite a few bits of fitness equipment which some will use for imaginative play as well.

Our play areas have recently undergone the ROSPA annual inspection and there are no major problems raised. Most areas where they have raised issues are in the Orchard Way area and the equipment identified there is being replaced in the New Year. Mid Devon District Council are again raising the cost of regular inspections and so we are having to reconsider our arrangements with them when showing due diligence with how the Parish Council treat your money.

David Williams, who has been our invaluable handyman for a number of years will be retiring in January 2025. He has been invaluable to the parish from looking after the cemetery and maintenance and grass cutting in play areas. Thank you David and have a long and happy retirement and may your narrowboat have safe journeys on the various canals you visit. We are looking for a replacement to David and the position has been advertised and there has been interest so hopefully a replacement will be found in time. At the same time the Parish Council are seeking contractors to cut grass and hedges in some of the play areas and the cemetery. The decisions may well have been made by the time you read this.

We are also considering representations as to stopping weed spraying and not cutting areas of grass in the interests of wildlife. We have to balance this with other residents in the village who like to see everything clean, neat and tidy. We also have to bear in mind safety requirements in relation to visibility splays at junctions and the practicalities and cost of 'fragmenting' contracts.

Please let us know what you think, and this is one area where maintaining your position as one of the 'silent majority' will not help. I, and I am sure some other councillors feel the same, consider I am damned if I do and damned if I don't. Thoughtful compromise will probably be the order of the day.

A few minor changes are being made in the cemetery by the planting of some trees and some wildlife friendly screening hedge. We are also considering having an area of 'wildlife meadow' until such time as it is needed for burials in years to come. The cost of creating it is quite high and then we have to balance future maintenance cost against 'normal' grass cutting. Another decision where we will probably be on the losing side with someone whichever decision is finally made. We are also in the process of taking the plants around to our volunteers to provide the 'winter' planting of the planters/troughs and we thank all our volunteers for their efforts. The trees, hedging and plants have all come from The Old Well Garden Centre where the staff have risen to the challenge to meet our needs in spite of their recent fire. Although outside our Parish boundary I am sure that we all wish them well as they move to rebuild in the future.

The Parish Councillors are all volunteers and give of their time freely for the benefit of our community and to comply with legal requirements. We welcome a new lady member with Sam Sycamore but we still have two vacancies that can be filled by 'volunteers'.

We are in the process of setting next year's budget to apply for the precept for the year 2025/26. This is guite a task, and our Clerk has already started putting spreadsheets together. There will be a budget meeting towards the end of December and then the final precept will be set at our January 2025 meeting. As always any views or ideas for consideration from our community are welcome. Apart from various things set in the budget which may lead to cost rises for us from suppliers and contractors - the one big thing that has jumped out at us is the rise to the employers contribution to National Insurance. It was £1,300.00 which will now rise by about £1,700.00 to a total of £3,000.00. The threshold has been reduced which means that we now have to contribute for the part time litter picker. We will do our best to keep our portion of the Council tax as low as possible, but we have no control over what Devon County and Mid Devon District Councils charge and then we have to add the Fire and Rescue Service and the almost uncontrolled demands of the Police and Crime Commissioner. On that cheerful note to end on can I try and lift spirits by wishing you all a very Happy Christmas and a Prosperous New Year. Please support our local clubs and organisations and at this time of year see what you can do to help and cheer those in our community who are not so well placed or lonely.

James emphasised the importance of having good local facilities and putting children, rather than competitive parents, first. Yasmin said how welcome she felt as a woman of colour in a supportive and non-judgmental environment.

As this goes to press, our gymnasts will be preparing for their Christmas display. For the new boys, it will be their first chance to demonstrate their new skills. We do not put the youngsters into competitions at 7-years-old, nor get them chasing certificates because we are thinking of their long-term development. Each child progresses at a different rate, and we want them all to fulfil their potential rather than 'fail' at a competition or a certification.

Teenagers and adults are different, they choose rather than being pushed by parents, and we are preparing for a weightlifting competition in Lydney, Gloucestershire in January. We took a group of spectators, lifters and a referee to the Plymouth Open in September. Lucy, 16, described the event as 'empowering.' She enjoyed seeing women encourage each other and demonstrate their skills, no matter how old. This was a different experience from her school p.e.

Our track and field athletes are in the middle of winter-training, working on strength and power, while the days are short. These sessions are suitable for other sporting teenagers who want to improve their physical skills too. New members are always welcome.



DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

This is just a flavour of what has been happening at County. We will be getting into the budget preparation within the next two months, we have to have the budget agreed by February.

At Month 6 it is estimated that budgets will overspend by just over £4 million an improvement of £2 million on the month 4 position. However, it is important to note that this excludes the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) deficit.

Financial risks within Integrated Adult Social Care and Children and Young People's Futures are still being experienced, but the work underway across the whole authority to support these pressures continues to ensure the whole organisation is focused on achieving a break-even position for the end of the year.

Pressures continue to be felt within the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) around demand for Special Educational Needs services both locally and nationally. As part of the Chancellor's Budget on 30th October, the Government has recognised these pressures and has allocated an additional £1 billion to support Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

More than 1,600 primary school children from across Devon got 'Farmwise' this month and saw for themselves where our food comes from and how it's made.

We invited Key Stage 2 primary school children from 40 primary schools, and they rolled up their sleeves and got stuck into a range of activities.

It's the 11th time this annual event has been held and teachers and children tell us it's the absolute highlight of their year.

The event is a collaboration between Southwest Norse, Devon County Agricultural Association, Mole Valley Farmers and us and takes place at Westpoint.

This year it was attended by our Leader, Councillor James McInnes, Chair of the Council, John Hart and members of our Strategic Leadership Team, Maria Price and Maria Chakraborty.

The Council's Revenue Budget for 2024/25 was £743 million, which was 6.3% higher than the previous year (£699 million) and made provision for £48.5 million or inflation and national living wage (NLW), £44.8 million for growth and other pressures and included savings, alternative funding or additional income of £49.5 million.

For the Children and Young People's Futures Directorate, the Budget was set at £227.7 million, an increase of 10.4%. This excludes the Dedicated Schools Grant which is allocated directly to schools.

The Council receives funding for its services in a variety of ways. This includes general funding through local taxation including council tax and a share of business rates; general grants from Government through the annual finance settlement for example revenue support grant, rural services delivery grant, social care grant; and other grant funding specific to services such as the Dedicated Schools Grant. The Council also receives income directly from service users in some cases, for example in contributions towards social care. The additional £21.5 million investment in Children's Services was made up from £30.6 million in inflation, national living wage and other pressures, £8.5 million in savings and £564,000 in alternative sources of funding and additional income.

In 2023-24, the average recycling rate (N192) for Devon's WCAs was 50.1%, an increase of 1.3% on the previous year. For authorities signed up to the mutually beneficial 'Shared Savings Scheme' (SSS), the average rate last year was 54.3%, with founding SSS member East Devon returning to 60%+ performance which it first achieved in 2019-20. During 2023-24, East Devon (60.1%), Mid Devon (57.9%), Teignbridge (54.2%), West Devon (53.7%), and Torridge (53.5%) all achieved recycling rates over 50% which places these authorities in the top 20% of English WCAs. With the exception of West Devon (-0.2%), all DASWC authorities increased their recycling performance. Devon's rate, as Torbay, also includes Recycling Centres, and achieved a recycling rate of 54.5% (+0.5%) following consecutive reductions in performance since its peak performance (56.6%) achieved in 2019-20. Torbay also showed a welcome return to performance growth at 40.1%, but this is 4.6% lower than its highest rate achieved in 2012-13 (44.7%)

Homes England: Mid Devon District Council has recently announced securing £34m towards the Cullompton Eastern Relief Road, which will relieve congestion in the town and open up opportunities for improved walking, cycling and more reliable bus routes. Devon County Council has been a key partner in securing these funds, being the lead on the planning, design and will likely be responsible for delivering the scheme.

It is that time of year again, soon comes around, for me to wish you all a happy Xmas and a healthy and happy new year. As always I am here to help if I can.


Seeing AI is a free app that tells you about the world around you. harnesses the power to open the visual world by describing nearby people, text and objects
