### **WILLAND THEATRICAL SOCIETY (WITS)**

The long-awaited **Agatha Crusty and the Village Hall Murders** was finally performed in September and went down extremely well with our audience.

I have cherry picked comments from **Patricia Barclay's** review for **The National Operatic and Dramatic Association** which was very praising for the whole show and the individual characters.

"This was a large cast representing the motley array of typical village characters and most especially those found in "Agatha Christie" land. Gossip, village politics, misunderstandings and "double entendres" abounded. Everyone worked well together, the various characters were clearly defined, and it was good too to see members of the group stretching themselves into different roles after pantomime. The production also gave good opportunity to gain experience with smaller parts"

"The script was particularly wordy and "tongue twisting" and the cast did well to keep everything on track, although much to the delight of the audience things did go awry at times and the lines "I don't know what you are talking about" proved to be particularly useful"



"There was a lot of setting and resetting of tables and chairs between scenes which was well handled by members of the cast and the backstage crew. Costumes were right for the characters and the lighting and sound suitably designed for the piece" "On reflection of course everything that went wrong or appeared to go wrong could have been part of a craftily contrived plot, cleverly executed by the performers on stage - it really was a mystery" **Patricia Barclay**.

The Auditions over and the cast selected and rehearsals ongoing for the annual Pantomime next February in the half term school holidays. The chosen Panto will be "**Treasure Island**" Which is a rip roaring, swashbuckling adventure that will delight the whole family watch this space for updates.



WiTS also performed a fund-raising Murder Mystery for the Walronds in Cullompton an historic House that was first mentioned in history in 1564 and relies on donations for its upkeep and maintenance. The Murder Mystery was performed at Willand Village Hall and seemed to go down a storm with lots of good feedback on social media. With the hall bedecked in banners and lots of authentic trappings it went down as a truly enjoyable evening.

I have recently again been honoured to represent the Parish at the Remembrance Service at the War Memorial in the Churchyard. It was wonderful to see so many people of all ages there and thanks must go to Simon, our Rector, and his team who put the service together. I believe that 150 orders of service were printed and people were having to share so we must have been near to the 200 mark for attendance. Thank you to our serving members of the armed services who attended in uniform. The representation from our Guides, Brownies Rangers, Cubs and Scouts was excellent and they were a credit to their parents and leaders. How wonderful to have the Last Post and Reveille played by a real musician – thank you – it makes all the difference. A big thank you to those who decorated the churchyard with the poppies for the period of remembrance.

Although financially things are becoming harder, we have monies to spend within the village courtesy of agreements entered into by the Developers of the 125 houses being built off Meadow Park. It is ring fenced for a specific purpose so we cannot use it to reduce the Council Tax but it is being used to provide things for the Community Centre [WHCC] at The Gables and then there are to be improvements at the Primary School later. The bulk of the monies are to be used to improve 'teen facilities', mainly within the Jubilee Field, but also elsewhere in the village. An order has been placed to make the current mounds [BMX track] into a proper pump track but it will be in the spring before the work will start as contractors are busy. We are also working towards replacing and improving the facilities at the small skateboard ramp.

Any other ideas such as better goal posts, outdoor gym etc should be given to the Parish Clerk to see what can be achieved if we have any money left over. Some different monies have been obtained which will be used to completely revamp the Chestnut Drive play area. The order is placed so watch this space as the area will be closed whilst the work is taking place.

You will recall that last year the Parish Precept did not rise although District, County, Police and Fire Service tax did. I cannot promise the same this year. We did ask in the last newsletter if you wanted us to reduce services like grass cutting and the like but from *the reply* received there was a 100% vote not to reduce our standards and therefore our precept will have to rise. No, I did not make a mistake using the singular, there was *one* resident who replied. It would be helpful if we had had more views to advise/help so we will have to do what we think is best for the village as a whole. Contracts are out for quotes for the next three years for grass verge cutting, weed spraying and various play area and open space maintenance. Do not be surprised if that goes up by 10 to 15 percent. On top of that the salaries have increased more than expected across all council areas. Having said that we will have more houses coming on line to pay council tax and so that will help a little. A £1,000 increase in our precept amounts to about 2p per week per Band D household. Not much if you say it quickly.

We have been seeking volunteers to look after the planters around the village and are grateful for those of our community who have come forward. You may notice a difference with the layout of some as individualistic ideas may come to the fore. We are having to make some changes as John Holmes, our 'litter picker' has not been well and is having to slow down a bit. We are grateful for Graham Bodkin stepping in as a temporary replacement. If any of you see litter about and can pick it up and put it in one of the bins or take it home, please feel free to do so. We are grateful for the management of 2 Sisters who are doing their best to keep the area around the factory and approaches clear of litter. There have been some rather disgusting deposits left in the motorway underpass which Highways England staff have had to deal with. I do not think dogs use newspaper to wipe their bottoms if you get my drift. The Village Hall Car Park had a similar experience but the CCTV footage will not be appearing on Facebook.

Some will have noticed that the Christmas Lights have been up around the village for some time and we are one short at Four Cross Way Roundabout due to a damaged lamp post which has since been repaired but we cannot get the light moved without paying out £400 not going to happen in these difficult times. The contractors put them up early for reasons best known to themselves without telling the Clerk. If any local businesses, or individuals, would like to contribute towards the cost of the lights our Clerk would be very pleased and grateful to hear from you PLEASE.

We do receive generous support each year which is much appreciated. The lights should be switched on by the time you receive this magazine copy.

Things have been relatively quiet around the Parish on the planning front but the Parish Council has received a briefing from a company wanting to put about 160 acres of solar panels up the bottom of the valley towards Halberton. Only one field appears to be in our parish and the rest will be in Halberton. There is an application in Halberton for another anaerobic digester plant which is going to be catering for more than 'on farm' needs and so you may wish to have a look at that and comment. Please remember if you do not let your views or concerns be known, one way or the other, it is no good moaning about it after it is approved and built.

Potential parish boundary changes are being considered and a final decision will be made at a special Mid Devon District Council meeting on 1 December 2022. You can go and speak if you wish to have your views known by way of asking a question.

May I take this opportunity to thank Gerri Taylor and her helpers for preparing the magazine and getting it through your letter boxes before Christmas. On behalf of the Parish Council, I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. Please enjoy the festive season safely and please do not forget those who are less fortunate or who may be lonely. Just a few minutes of your time and kindness may mean a great deal to them. **Barry G J Warren**.

### WILLAND COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH (WCSW)

I am delighted to say that we now have a team of 7 volunteers, thank you everybody. Ideally, we'd like another 5 to make 12 in total because the other piece of good news is that all the roads in Willand with a speeding issue are now fully approved by the police for CSW. If we get the extra volunteers, we will ask the police for another set of equipment so that we can run more sessions.

So far, the police have sent out 20 letters to drivers reported by WCSW and this will probably rise sharply as we become more active.

The team now has a good network of key relationships with the various police teams, e.g. the Commercial & Agricultural team, Roads Policing Team, etc. You may have seen 3 RPT officers conducting a speed check session at the entrance to Willand Football Club recently and pulling over quite a few vehicles.

We are now working on better communication with the police teams who launch initiatives such as Vision Zero South West (targets of halving deaths and serious injury by 2030, and zero by 2040) so that WCSW can play its part. Take a look at https://visionzerosouthwest.co.uk

So, we would ask drivers to **stick to the speed limits** - as we always say, we would rather deter drivers from speeding than catch them.



#### **DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL**

We have been given a statement of the financial position of the County, I thought it would be useful for you know the situation, it is not good, we have a lot of work to do to produce a balanced budget.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer has set out the Government's economic plan which includes a further squeeze on public sector spending from April 2023.

Even before this announcement, Devon County Council is projecting that savings of £75 million will be needed next financial year (April 2023 to March 2024) unless the Government intervenes.

Councils are required by law to balance their books, but with few available reserves left in the bank, this leaves Devon, like many other councils, at a very real risk of bankruptcy unless action is taken by the Government. All this comes on top of the huge savings we are already having to make in this financial year,

and we would like to thank everyone for their tremendous efforts so far in helping to find and make these savings.

But today we have taken the decision to issue a stark public warning that if the situation does not change, then radical cuts that have a significant impact on the quality of life for everyone in Devon will be unavoidable.

I know this message is hard to hear and will raise many questions and concerns.

The important services that we help to provide are the lifeblood of our county and directly impact on tens of thousands of local people. Many of you will also, alongside family and friends, use the County Council's wide range of services.

We would like to stress that absolutely no decisions have been made about where any cuts might happen, and some very difficult conversations will be taking place over the coming weeks with our Strategic Leadership Team and elected Members to find savings whilst limiting the impact on everyone as best we can.

We have never witnessed a financial crisis in local government of this magnitude. We have always been rightly proud of the authority's sound fiscal management, our ability to manage the resources we have, and adapt how we work together with our partners in order to protect vital local services and support the most vulnerable.

But these are unprecedented times. Rising demand for services after the pandemic, rising costs and the impact of inflation are all taking their toll.

The interim Chief Executive is determined to do all she can alongside our elected Members and leaders to fight for Devon's corner, for our vital services, for you and for the people of Devon.

Our Leader, Councillor John Hart, is lobbying Devon MPs to make very clear the dire financial situation we find ourselves in and he has also written personally to the new Prime Minister laying out the risk to public services.

As a reminder, through our Financial Sustainability work we are already making £36 million of savings this financial year (April 2022 to March 2023). This has been achieved across all services and includes holding vacancies in non-frontline areas and stopping some routine road maintenance. We are squeezing all our contracts with external service providers and reviewing things like school transport for children with disabilities, as well as delaying planned investments in IT and infrastructure projects, and cutting office heating and lighting bills.

We are reviewing all high-cost activity in both Children's and Adult Services with the focus on transforming and improving the support we give while saving resources. We are also reviewing our properties and will be looking to dispose of assets where they are no longer needed.

Even then we must find a further £37 million this financial year, largely because of rising demand in adult and children's social care, higher prices for care

packages and a higher national pay award to reflect the cost of living increases we all face.

I will, of course, keep you updated on our financial position and response

With the rising costs of food and energy starting to bite, councils are focusing on what they can do to help support individuals and families.

Recently, we made a few announcements about help or advice available.

There are national schemes available to help households with the current cost of living, and information about all of them are available on the one central government **Cost of Living Support website.** Discounts and offers are available for businesses to help with the cost of living.

The Local Government Association (LGA) **cost of living hub** continues to share best practice designed to help councils to support their residents with the rising cost of living.

#### **Mobile Boost Scheme**

CDS operates the Mobile Boost Scheme, funded through the Heart of the South West Local Enterprise Partnership's Growth Deal, which is upgrading indoor 4G mobile phone coverage in rural areas. The initiative has helped over 1,105 small businesses and homes which have inadequate coverage, or only have access to one provider and are struggling with connectivity. Businesses and households in Somerset, Devon, Torbay and Plymouth can apply for a voucher of up to £1,200 towards the cost of a mobile signal booster from a registered supplier. The value of the voucher is dependent on the type of technology most suitable for the premises.



#### **EXCELSIOR ATHLETIC DEVELOPMENT CLUB**

We have a new British Champion Gabby Sully-Dunbar competed in the British Weightlifting Age Group Championships, in Leeds, on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November. She won the under-23s, 59kg category, with a 62kg snatch and 78kg clean and jerk for a personal best total of 140kg.

Only a third of our weightlifters compete: the rest come along to learn a skill, get fit and train with like-minded people. Beginners are welcome.

As the weather deteriorates, we are more pleased than ever that gymnastics and weightlifting are indoor sports.

Training has now moved indoors until Spring and we have renamed it 'Sports Fitness'. #### **WILLAND HISTORY GROUP**

When you receive this, I am sure we'll be well into the ever-expanding festive season, so Happy Christmas everybody from Willand History Group. Back in October we held our AGM and were pleased to welcome new members, Helen and Peter. It also gave us great pleasure to reflect on a successful year that has seen the History Group get a bit more active again, after a long period of dormancy followed by the pandemic. We began planning our activities for next year, including more 'parish walks', plus an exhibition pencilled in for Saturday, 6 May 2023, to coincide with the King's Coronation, hopefully turning it into an everyone-welcome community event (with more details to follow, so watch this space). There isn't much else to report, other than a curious story that we discovered recently, reported in the *Devon & Somerset News*, about the Pook family. In June 1906, a Mr G.H. Pook arrived at Plymouth from Melbourne, Australia, and promptly declared that he had £30,000 he wished to give away

to families in need of charity. However, not before he had tracked down the relatives of his own late father, John Pook, who had once worked for 'Squire Clarke' at Bridwell House, Uffculme, before emigrating to Australia some 40-odd years previously.

His quest was reported in the local press, and one relative quick to come forward was Sarah Jane Payne of Willand, wife of Alfred Payne, who lived on Silver Street. She said she was a first cousin of Mr G.H. Pook on her mother's side, and could well remember John Pook working at Bridwell, but then having to leave after a 'misunderstanding', and then living for a short while in an old dairy house, subsequently demolished, at the bottom of an orchard, behind the Half Way House, off Muxbeare Lane. Sarah Jane Payne remembered going to see John Pook and his family at the dairy house on the night before they left for Australia; she said it was a lovely evening, and she had a ride on a donkey.

There were a lot of Pooks in Devon, and Sarah Jane Payne wasn't the only relative to come forward. In fact, Mr G.H. Pook hadn't realised quite how many relatives he did have, especially after his offer hit the national press. Thirty grand was a lot of money in 1906, after all. Within a week Mr G.H. Pook had received letters from '73 first cousins, 15 brothers-in-law, 117 second cousins, 56 third cousins, 190 relatives by marriage, 86 ladies whose maiden name was Pook, 19 ladies who have married Pooks, 17 uncles, 14 aunts, 8 grand-aunts. 106 persons tracing decent from his grandfather, 61 friends of his boyhood, 33 persons each claiming to be the head of the original Pook family, and 21 persons who knew his father'. Thankfully, Mr G.H. Pook was of 'religious temperament' and vowed to go through the 'huge pile of letters' and help where charity was genuinely needed. "I'm going to do what I can," he said, "but when I have had enough of it, I'll stop."

#### MID DEVON DISTRICT COUNCIL

The last few weeks have seemed to fly by at a pace with more than a few issues keeping councillors busy.

The local parish boundary review is nearly at an end with the hard fought over recommendations going to a full council meeting on 1st December, the Willand, Uffculme & Halberton proposals took about 70% of the total discussion time over all meetings with the final recommendation to be considered below. Therefore, the ERC proposed the following options for Halberton, Willand and Uffculme for part of the stage 2 public consultation:

Option 1 – Lucombe Park move from Halberton to Uffculme and the Mid Devon Business Park move from Halberton to Willand.

Option 2 – Option 1 (as set out above) together with the area northeast of Bridwell Avenue be moved from Halberton to Uffculme.

Option 3 – Options 1 and 2 (as set out above) together with Hitchcock's business park.

Final Vote to be taken by full council on 1st December.

I'm hoping all my hard work in trying to get the zebra crossing and the associated road fixed in South View Rd, will be completed pre Christmas, it's taken so long having to wait for DCC traffic orders and a lot of emails and phone calls, fingers crossed no last minute hiccups.

As with so many councils MDDC face a very uncertain future with predicted financial shortfalls looking likely without some difficult decisions having to be made. I'm hoping we move towards a more income generation way of thinking

and not simply try and cut more and more from the ever decreasing pie, I will be pushing for more investment in such projects.

There is still much to do in our local area and I hope to play my part in making things happen over the new few months, despite elections in May next year elected councillors still have a vital role to play, we were elected for 4 years not three and a half so heads down and keep going.
